THRILLS AND EPISODES OF ANGLING TRIP

Party Went Up Wark Channel and Caught Many Fish and Heard Wonderful Tales.

Many stories are now beginning to leak out about some of the excursions organized last week end by local sportsmen. None, however, had any more wonderful episodes and startling revelations than did the party of eleven who made the trip up to Wark Channel aboard the Eleanor Mac. The scenic beauties could never be excelled. At high tide a large salt water lake was entered and after climbing alongside a short waterfall a beautiful body of fresh water came to view. This was where the excitement started for the fish were there and they could be caught.

On the return of the various groups in the evening the tales of Billy Reid and Joe Brown were particularly thrilling to all the interested listeners who had not accompanied these dauntless ones on their little jaunt from the main party. The former caught a big conger eel but two ordinary sized men would have been unable to carry it out so the mighty eel still flirts around amongst the rushes at the base of Split Mountain. BIRTH CONTROL IS BEING DISCUSSED

Harold Cox, giving evidence at the Birth Rate Commission in London said that if birth control was in itself immoral now it would be immoral still when our population had reached a volume that the necessity for a reduction in the rate of increase became indisputable. When that time came, if birth control was banned as immoral, we should be forced to choose between various methods of death encouragement, such as infanticide, chronic under feeding, periodic massacres, and the propagation of deadly diseases. Even now for many women in England married life was one long disease. The State subsidy would only increase the evil, and he said the amount would probably lead to an increased production of babies by persons less fitted to be parents. Children begotten and reared by parents subsidised by the State would probably be content to lounge all their life leaning on the State.

Fears had been expressed lest a decline in our population should weaken England in relation to other countries. But we need not disquiet ourselves if the German population should increase more rapidly than ours. It would be futile to attempt to deal with the German peril by means of a cradle competition. Our island was too small to afford possibilities for a full life to all the millions now crowded upon us, and he therefore welcomed a decline in the population, and hoped it would be continued.
