

Nine Jet Planes Crash To Build In Air Force Manoeuvre Railway

RICHMOND, Indiana (-Nine United States Air Force F84 jet fighters plunged to earth in a thunderstorm near here yesterday, killing four pilots while six other airmen died in three separate crashes in the west.

The jet fighters fell out of the sky in quick succession around Richmond, showering wreckage over a wide area. In addition to the dead, two other pilots were injured, one
