MUCH FRUIT ON THE MARKET

Peaches Being Sold for Preserving
—New Potatoes Sell at
\$2.75 a Sack.

Last week has been peaches week in the local stores and many crates of first class fruit have been sold. The rush will very likely continue for the next week. The season for Bartlett pears is going to be brief this year as there is a marked scarcity. Apricots are now off the local market with only a few red currants and gooseberries arriving. Black currants and white currants are past for this year and those who have not done their preserving along these lines will have to do without. Pumpkin, citron, squash and marrow are beginning to arrive in quantities, but are being rapidly used up as their time is short.

The vegetables continue about the same with a slight drop in onions and new potatoes are now at \$2.75 per sack. The up river shipments of ground produce has not been of the very best and there has been a marked scarcity of such side dishes as cauliflower.

Local butchers are of the opinion that a slight fall in price is expected in meat during the next week. The flood season in the fresh meat market is on at present and the government investigations are also forcing the hands of the controlling interests. They will not remain low for long however, as the winter scarcity will soon set in. The following are the current prices:
