Baby Steals Fashion Show

NEW YORK (AP)—The fashion show model appeared in his mother's arms and practically stole the show. But there were approving nods too for his white broadcloth and cotton plaid "demi-suit" with its spirited plaid cocking-horse applique.

It was one of the latest bo-peep fashions for the carriage set, in which designer Hulda Schorr aimed at practicability and comfort combined with smart appearance.

The "demi-suit" and sister's "demi-dress" are two-piece affairs consisting of short, loose-hanging top and plastic-lined diaper-cover-up and bib to match. They are made alike except that sister's top is gathered in yoke while inverted pleats provide brother with room for movement.

Of interest to mother: The materials are sturdy, color-fast and machine-washable.

For toddlers of one to three years Mrs. Schorr—whose grandchildren are helping to keep her interested in practical angles—has designed a self-help coverall to aid in teaching the children to care for themselves. The drop-seat of the overall-like garment has a belt which fastens in front with two buttons, large enough to be manageable for small fingers. One style is in navy broadcloth with bright red rickrack points edging collar and cuffs; red cross-stitching forms the words "Good Boy" or "Good Girl" across the front.

Colorfully embroidered cobbler aprons in denim are among the protective garments Mrs. Schorr features for the small fry. Three big pockets provide space for carrying childhood treasures. Worn with matching slacks, they make sturdy play outfitts.

Efficiency in Housekeeping

NEW YORK (AP) — Some women use as much energy making a bed as a male efficiency expert would use in a day's factory work.

Cleaning up the living room after last night's bridge session can be more difficult than digging a ditch all day, if a woman puts her mind to being inefficient about it.

Just doing the regular housework despite push-button appliances, can leave an average putterer in an exhausted state.

All this is pointed out by home appliance experts, usually male, who claim most women walk useless miles around the house every day.

Taking making a bed. The usual procedure is for a woman to pull the sheets and blankets off the bed, walk across the room and pile them in a chair. Then she takes the bottom sheet, walks back, tucks it in on one side, walks around the bed to tuck it in on the other side, and repeats this process with top sheet, blanket, quilt and spread.
