Blackwood on Bridge

Sometimes I wonder how Mr. Meek learned to play the cards so well. With his conservative bidding habits he seldom gets into contracts which require tough, daring, brilliant play. I just wonder where he gets the practice.

He made all 13 tricks on this hand but declined to bid further after Mrs. Keen's powerful jump to four spades.

Mr. Abel led the king of hearts and Mr. Meek won with the ace on the board. He paused to check the situation over. Unless all five outstanding spades were in one opponent's hand, he had 10 tricks in straight leads—four spades, five diamonds and a heart.

He thought about a cross-ruff. He knows, of course, that the first thing to do when planning a cross-ruff is to cash the quick side suit winners. He saw that if he could cash two diamond tricks, he could then cross-ruff clubs and hearts for eight more tricks. These, with the ace of hearts, would make a total of 11 tricks.

CHANCE TO TAKE ALL

But wait, if neither opponent had a singleton diamond there was a good chance to take all

the tricks. So Mr. Meek played in the following manner. After winning the opening trick with the ace of hearts, he immediately led a small heart and ruffed it with the deuce of spades.

He overtook his 10 of diamonds with dummy's king and led another heart, ruffing it with the 10 of spades. The jack of diamonds was overtaken with the ace on the board and dummy's last heart was led.

UNLOCKS WITH ACE

This one Mr. Meek ruffed with his ace of spades, unblocking so he would have a trump lead to the board. Then he led the queen of spades and won it with dummy's king.

On the lead of dummy's jack of spades, Mr. Meek carefully discarded his queen of dia-

Showers Help To Remain In Canada

WINNIPEG — Weather continued mostly cool throughout the west during the past week with good rains to scattered showers occurring to the weekly crop report of the department of agriculture of the Canadian National Railways.

Some areas would welcome further rains particularly those in the "light shower" districts but in general warmer weather is now the most important crop requirement.

Wheat has commenced to head out at a few points in Manitoba but is later in other provinces.

It has been dry in the Okanagan during the past week. Early cherries have started to move in small quantities at Penticton and Bing cherries will commence to move about this week-end and should be moving in volume about July 4. This crop will be about 75 per cent of last year's production. Apples, which will be 300 to 400 per cent over last year, will commence moving from Penticton around July 17 to 20. The peach crop is expected to be six times greater than last year in volume and is expected to move in carload lots to Saskatchewan and Manitoba markets. Apples for the fresh fruit market are now estimated at 7 million boxes as compared with 7,900,000 last season.
