Alberta Gets Too Much Rain
WINNIPEG—Spring seeding is general throughout Manitoba, mostly under favorable conditions. Seeding operations are also under way throughout Saskatchewan but this province shows considerable variation in the progress made to date, according to the weekly crop report of the department of agriculture of the Canadian National Railways.
Seeding in Alberta will not be general for perhaps a week owing to excessive moisture conditions. In a number of the earliest districts in the west wild oats are causing trouble. In these same areas, some wheat is now a good two inches above the ground.
Two nice rains are reported from the Okanagan Valley during the past week, considerably improving tree fruit prospects. Last week's percentages by fruit varieties, however, stand as the best available estimate at this date. No further damage from any source is indicated.
