Lost Leg in CN Station

Variety of Articles Include Kitchen Sink

TORONTO. — Somewhere, walking around Canada, there is a man who lost his leg in the Canadian National Railways baggage room at Toronto's Union Station. At least, that's the only conclusion Charlie Hutchings, CNR lost article clerk, can come to for the artificial leg as one half of a baggage check led to it.

"How do I know it's a man's leg?" asked Hutchings. "Well, I can hardly imagine a woman being as forgetful as that. Besides," he added, "there was no ink stocking on the leg."

Artificial limbs are only one of the headaches Charlie Hutchings encounters as he sorts thousands of lost articles and unclaimed baggage before they are sold at public auction. False teeth, baby carriages, a bath-tub from Poland, countless trunks and suitcases and even two Civil War swords are among

the host of unclaimed baggage. "In this department, we've found everything but the kitchen sink," Hutchings said, "but just the other day, we even received that. It came from overseas and was probably left by some immigrants."

Books, too, are among articles travellers seem to forget aboard trains and their titles include anything from "True Confessions" to "Poget's Thesaurus of English Words and Phrases."

"This place could be a regular gold mine," said Hutchings as he glanced around at the thousands of forgotten articles. "Although regulations stipulate that the company must keep each article for a year after it is found, we never open the trunks or suitcases. They are sold just the way they stand and, for all I know, the buyer could be purchasing a suitcase of rag dolls or one filled with thousand dollar bills. It's strictly a surprise package."

As soon as the unclaimed items are catalogued and ready for the auction block during the first week in May, Charlie Hutchings will head for Miami and a well-earned rest—3000 miles away from lost articles and forgetful people.

many high cards he could have. Now if Mr. Muzzy had both the king and queen of diamonds the right play was to duck in dummy and let the ten in the closed hand win.

But what if Mr. Muzzy had bid on six diamonds to the king or queen. He often does. In that case Mr. Dale would have a doubleton honor and to play low from dummy would permit him to win and fire the suit back immediately, setting up the remaining diamonds in Mr. Muzzy's hand.

Mr. Champion was somewhat inclined toward this latter set-up. One reason was that when Mr. Muzzy has a long suit headed by the king-queen he is usually undecided whether to lead the fourth highest or the king whereas in this case he had led very promptly.

If Mr. Dale did have a doubleton diamond honor, the right play at trick one was the ace from dummy. That would leave Mr. Dale with a lone honor and when the club finesse was taken and lost (as expected) the diamond suit would be blocked.

Mr. Champion gave the situation a lot of thought. He rubbed his head, closed his eyes, crossed and uncrossed his legs, stared at the ceiling and lit a cigarette when he already had one going. He had a tough decision, all right. Anybody could go wrong on this particular
