Historic Island's Building Boom

CHRISTIAN ISLAND, Ont. (CP)—This historic island in Georgian Bay is experiencing a housing boom.

It's a slow-moving boom because the 370 Chippewa Indians who live here aren't anxious to build a city overnight. They realize the need for new houses—some of them were built a century ago—and are building them themselves.

Henry Gauthier, agent on the island for the Department of Indian Affairs, persuaded the band to re-open a sawmill at the edge of the village in 1949, and work has gone ahead steadily.

The tribe has a credit of more than \$200,000 in Ottawa from the sale of Beausoleil Island to the government. One thousand dollars of this is put toward the cost of each house built, and the rest is paid off in instalments.

Cost of the buildings is about \$2,400 each. They would sell for \$6,000 in the city. The Indians build the houses themselves and are paid for their work. Some veterans' families also applied Veteran Land Act credits to their new homes.

Chief Simpson King, elected in June, and his four councillors select the families in greatest need to occupy the new houses as they are completed.

Slowly the island village is becoming urbanized. Agent Gauthier isn't trying to hurry the process because he believes in allowing the Indians to do things in their own way.

Originally known as St. Joseph's Island, it was named Christian Island in 1949 when Jesuit missionaries sought its sanctuary along with the Huron followers who had survived the Iroquois massacres.

A fort was built on the east shore of the island, but in 1650 the Jesuits abandoned the island and with their Huron converts returned to the valley of the St. Lawrence.
