Abel worked out with the coast team while in Vancouver on his holidays last August. He has played as catcher with city leagues here for past three years.

He was on the winning teams, Abel & Odowes last year, and the Merchants the year before, under the management of his business partner John Odowes.

Abel has had baseball experience in the East, playing with the Regina Red Sox.

SPORT SHOTS

An impressive and colorful ceremony at the National Stadium in New Delhi, marked the close of the Asian Games recently. After the day's events Prime Minister Nehru took the salute as athletes from 11 participating countries marched past in a colorful pageant led by massed bands in scarlet, blue and gold. Afterwards, the Asian Games flag with the sun in the middle and 11 interlinked circles under it, was lowered amid a boom of guns and the torch, which had burnt all through the progress of the games, was extinguished. The flag and the torch were handed over to the Chief Commissioner of Delhi for safe keeping. They were wanted by the Philippines, the host country for the Second Asian Games in 1955.

The Maharaja of Patiala, President of the Federation, then mounted the Tribune of Honour and declared the First Asian Games closed. In Olympic tradition he added: "I call upon the youth of every Asian country to assemble in four years at Manila, there to celebrate with us the Second Games of Asia. May they display cheerfulness and concord so that the sports torch may be carried on with even greater eagerness, courage and honour for the good of humanity through the ages."

It was a glorious day for Japan as the curtain was rung down in "Asiad." B athletes won the majority of events, standing first in nine of the fourteen events of the programme. In individual events Japan led with 168 points and India was second with 116 points. Japan's event...

Regulation Loads and Speed on the Northern Trans-Provincial Highway from GALLOWAY RAPIDS to TYEE
The Undersigned, being a person authorized by the Minister of Public Works, in writing, to exercise the powers vested in the Minister in Part II of the "Highway Act," and being of the opinion that that portion of the Northern Trans-Provincial Highway from Galloway Rapids to Tyee is liable to damage through extraordinary traffic thereon, hereby makes the following Regulation pursuant to Section 35 of the Highway Act.
The following load and speed limitations are imposed on the said highway until further notice:—
No person shall operate a vehicle over the Northern Trans-Provincial Highway from Galloway Rapids to Tyee having a maximum gross weight or loading in excess of fifty per cent of that allowed in the Regulations made pursuant to Section 36 of the "Highway Act," R.S.B.C. 1948.
The speed limit of vehicles with pneumatic tires is restricted to twenty miles per hour. Vehicles with solid tires are prohibited from using this Highway during such times as this regulation is in force. DATED at Prince Rupert, B.C., the 21st day of March, 1951.
