Note that dummy has the same high cards in hearts as the closed hand has in the spade suit, namely ace, queen and ten. But Mr Dale realized he had to play the suits differently. If he lost one spade trick then he could not afford to lose any tricks in hearts. Holding only two hearts in his own hand, Mr. Dale knew there was no point in double finessing. In other words his best play to avoid any heart losers was to play the queen from dummy at the third trick, finessing against only one card, the king.
