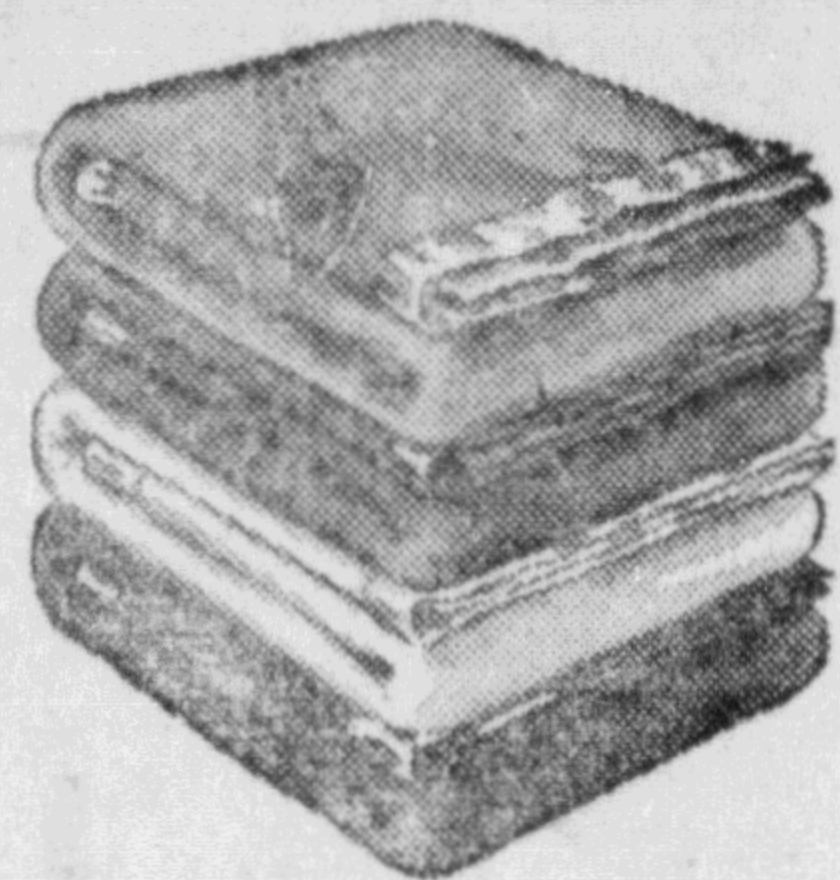

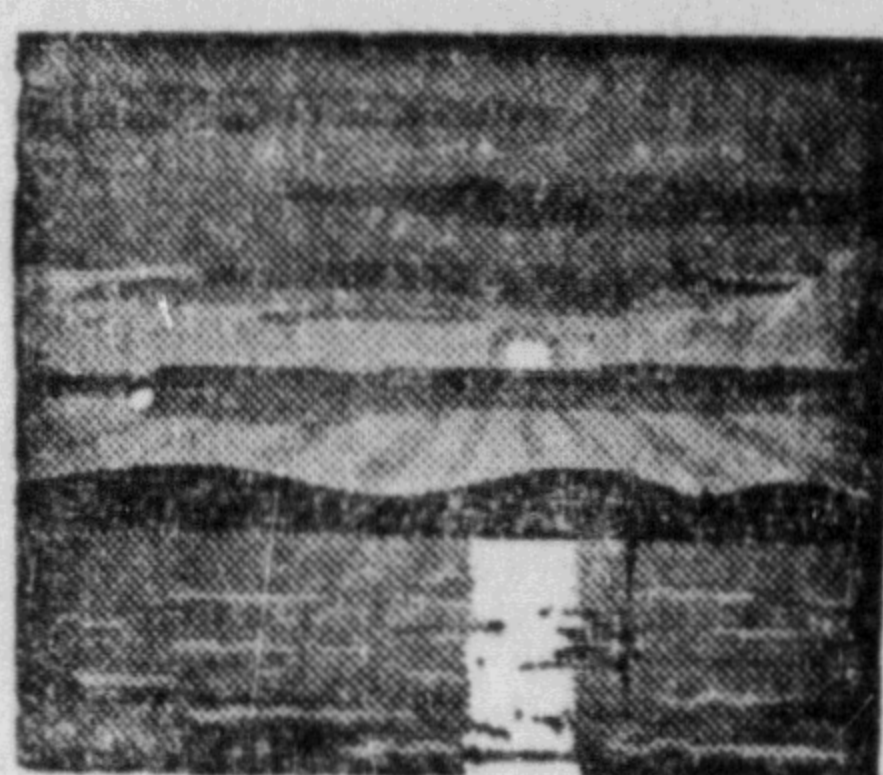

## WATERFRONT - - WHIFFS

First Herring of Season Landed—Panamanian Ship at Watson Island—New Dry Dock Fire Chief

First of this season's herring were landed at Prince Rupert Thursday by the packer Hillside, Capt. H. E. Scott, and were unloaded at Atlin Fisheries Ltd. for freezing and at Bacon Fisheries for future smoke cure.

Today, the New Laurel, Capt. Alf and Jack Ritchie, also came in with a small load of herring, packing them from Kitkatla Inlet, where the Hillside obtained her load. Canadian Fishing Co.'s Butedaje seiners are fishing the area.

At Port Edward, Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd., the meal plant has been operating all week as company packers have unloaded some 900 tons of first season's herring from Ogden Channel.

Next week, officials hope to operate the plant at full capacity. Main fleet is expected in Sunday night.

The freighter Falcon, of Panamanian registry, with a Greek crew, sailed yesterday morning after unloading a cargo of 2260 long tons of sulphur at Watson Island.

Department of Transport classes for masters of vessels under 150 tons opened this week at HMCS Chatham with 38 entries and Harbor Master Capt. William Koughan as instructor.

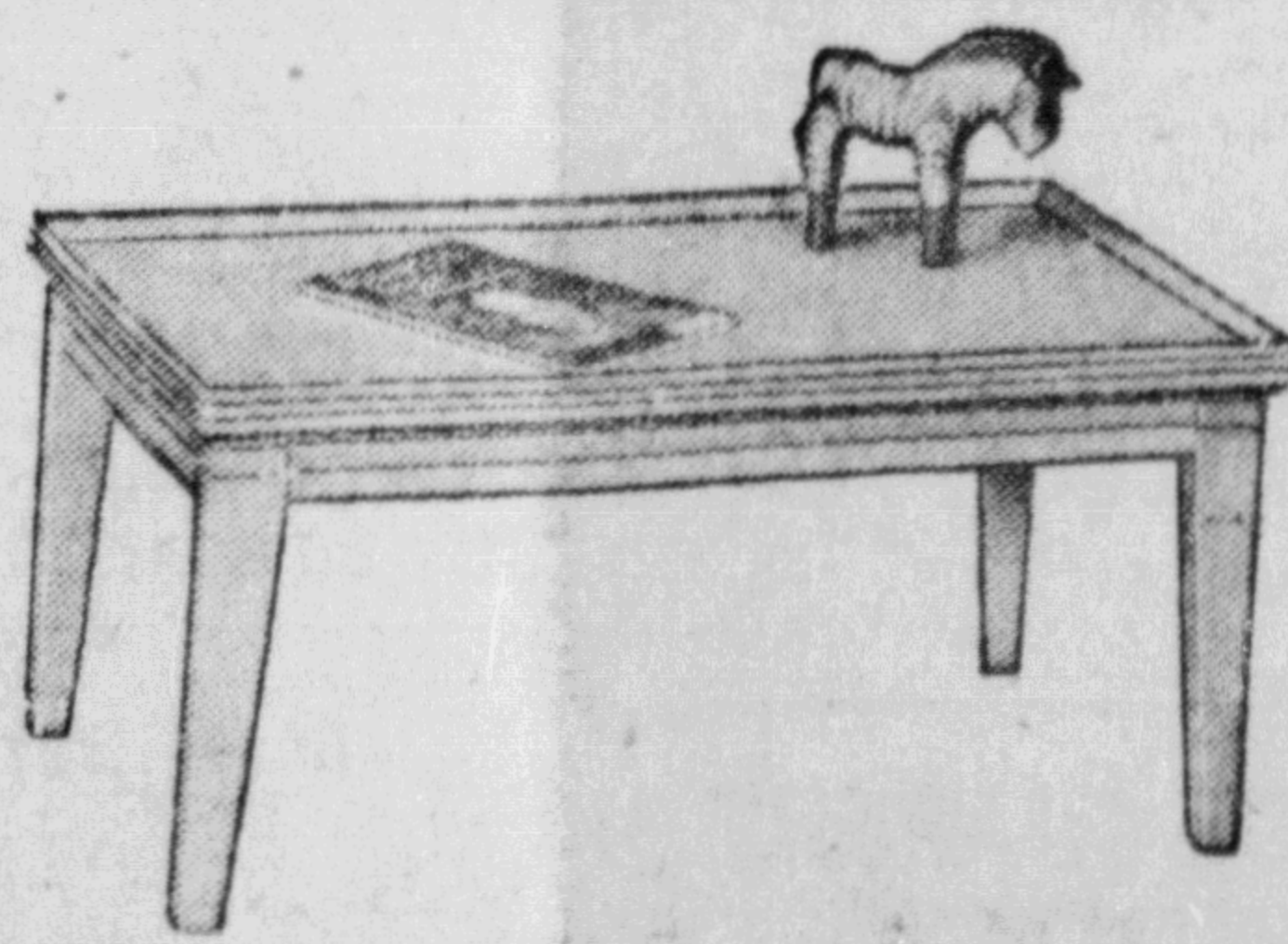

main an unlovely memory. Soon, however, one found ease and rest in the swing of a hammock and notes of reveille and the repeated invitations to "show a leg." Table linen and china could be fancied but not seen. Plates and mugs were of metal. Each member of mess took his turn performing orderly duties. This included packing rations and washing up. There were no waiters. And verily, there was no music. Lights were out sharp, at a certain time. Seasickness attacked about everyone for a while. One youth had more than that, for he went over the side. On a cold, dark afternoon, off Newfoundland, the Sardinian slowed down, the contingent paraded, and in a few minutes the weighted body shot into the icy deep.

### STILL USING STEAM

The most powerful tug on the coast, the "Sudbury" is still a steam vessel, despite the fact that very few are left. Nearly all are fitted with diesel engines. The Sudbury was formerly a Navy corvette, being later converted to towing purposes. She is rated at 2,750 horsepower.

Naval architects competed at a recent seamanship assembly in New York. This posed a series of difficult situations and emergencies. Among these were: what to do when a man is swept overboard in a gale at night from a 50-foot schooner equipped for ocean racing; what to do when the main mast snaps, or a rudder breaks; how to guard against explosions and fires at sea and what to do when they occur.

The Davis raft, a not uncommon sight in northern waters, is formed by enclosing within boomsticks a floor of logs formed by weaving them together with wires. Other logs are placed on this floor which gradually submerge until there is a floating boom of logs that may be anywhere from thirty to forty feet thick and of which two-thirds is submerged. The whole boom is then bound with wires to bring rigidity. It was in 1941, a Davis raft was towed by the tug St. Faith, subsequently known as C. D. Brooks, from Cumshewa Inlet in the Queen Charlotte Islands to Vancouver. This took a month. The raft was 800 feet long, eighty feet wide, with a thirty foot draft and consisting of 4,350,000 feet board measure.

The coast will soon have another of the growing fleet of Johnson Line motorships, the Silver Gate having been launched this month at Kiel, in Germany. She will sail for Canada about the end of December. She has four sister ships. They are passenger-cargo craft, 19½ knots, 9,000 deadweight tonnage, and luxury accommodation for twelve passengers. Running time between the coast and Sweden will be 23 days.

## "Anna Lucasta" Dramatic Film

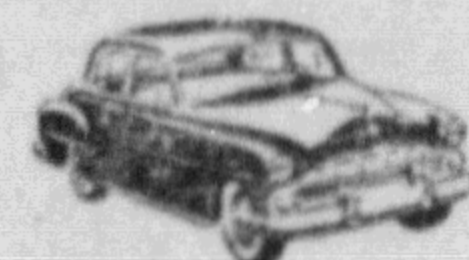
