BASKETBALL MATCH FOR LAST EVENING

At a meeting of the sports committee of the Fair, to be held tomorrow, it is expected that arrangements will be finally made for field sports on one of the three days of the fair. The sum of \$150 has been set aside for prizes and a special prize for ladies' races has been promised by Fred Stork.

In order that all the sports may be seen to advantage the fair directors have arranged to extend the grand stand at the athletic grounds and make it a really creditable sitting out place for the use of which an admission charge will be made. A bandstand will also be built to accommodate the large forty-piece bands that will be in attendance.

The football association is arranging for games and a baseball team will be here from Anyox and possibly from New Metlakatla to play the local nine. In addition to that there will be junior teams here from Essington and other points and many of the visitors will also take part in the field sports.

A basketball match has been arranged for the last evening to precede the big masquerade ball.

Very soon it will be possible to give a complete program of the sports for the three days.

"COMMON CLAY" IS GREAT PRODUCTION

Famous Screen Success to be Shown for the First Time Tonight at the Westholme Theatre.
