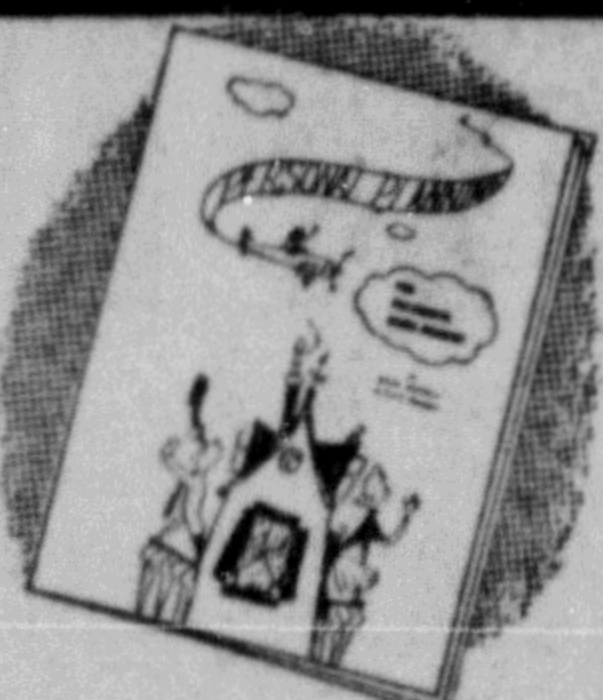

Swim Classes Start Well

130 Young Enthusiasts Take To Water on Opening Day

Cloudy weather and even a little rain did not dampen the spirits of 130 young swimming enthusiasts yesterday afternoon as Civic Centre swim classes got under way at Gyro pool.

Ranging from ages seven to 15—girls outnumbering boys about two to one—Instructors Ian McHardy and Gloria Sather divided the group into three parts. The first group—those who can't swim—contains some 80 youngsters but they didn't get a chance yesterday. By the time all were sorted out as to groups it was too late for the first class.

The second class—with about 30 students—are those who can swim but need improvement in style, breathing and kicking. Most of them can get across the pool and Mr. McHardy thinks they "will make real good swimmers by the end of the season."

NOT AFRAID
"I am surprised the way these kids take to the water," he said. "They're not afraid and that is the first step in learning to swim."

Miss Sather is in charge of the senior class, in which about 20 have enrolled who will be learning advanced techniques in water sport such as fancy dives. Life-saving will also be included.
