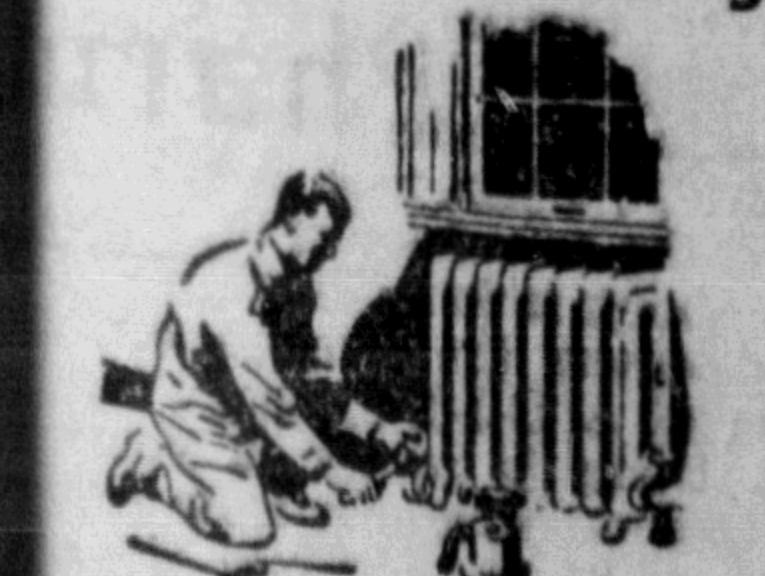

The funeral will take place on Friday.

Sixty-seven years of age, Mrs. Stewart was born in the Naas River village of Greenville. She was the widow of Arthur Stewart who was drowned in the Skeena River at Port Essington in 1925 and for the past three years had lived at Sunnyside where she fell ill two weeks ago and was brought to the Prince Rupert General Hospital.

Mrs. Stewart is survived by one son, Moses Stewart, and four daughters—Mrs. John (Alice) Gray of Greenville; Mrs. Charles (Laura) Lincoln of Kincolith; Mrs. William (Hazel) Ridley of Kitkatla and Mrs. Frank (Ida) Russ of Kitkatla. There are twenty-six grandchildren. Brothers and sisters are Mrs. Peter (Ella) Adams of Aiyansh, Mrs. Stephen (Lily) Eli of Aiyansh, Mrs. Hohnson (Selma) Russ of Greenville and Mrs. Job (Emily) Clark of Greenville.

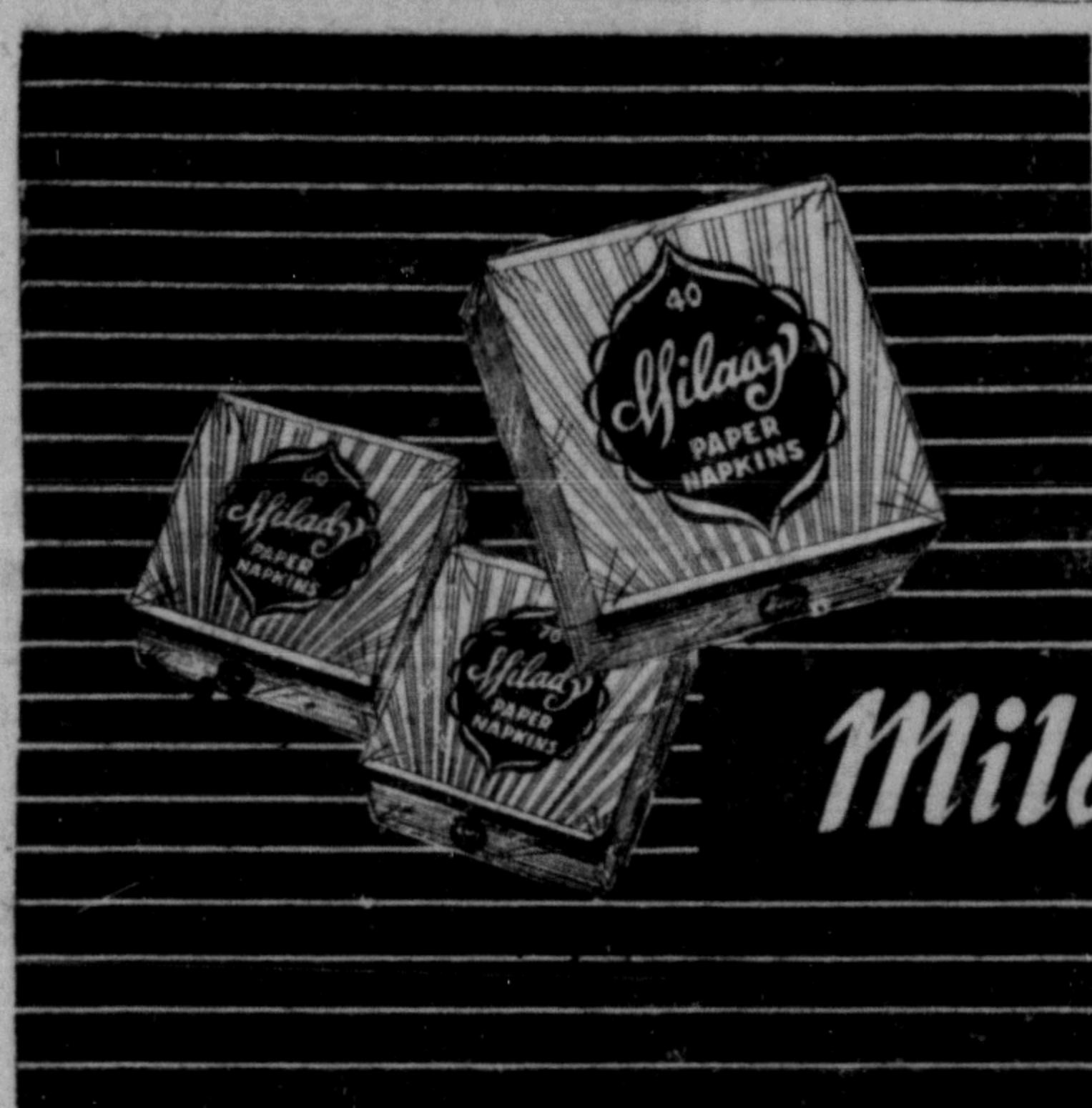
