Blackwood on Bridge

Mr. Abel thought he had a pretty good chance
to defeat this contract. He was right. In fact he
probably would have defeated it if someone else had
been the declarer, Mr. Muzzy, for example. Mr. Muzzy
is crazy about finessing and that mania would have
proved his undoing on this particular deal.

Mr. Masters, on the other hand
defers a finesse as long as he
can. He always looks for a better
play—a play which offers a
higher percentage of chance for
success.

In today's hand he could count
eight sure winners after the ace
of clubs was knocked out. A
finesse of the queen of hearts
was one possibility of getting the
ninth trick. That was at best a
50-50 shot.

Mr. Masters disdained the
heart finesse. He found a play
that was 100 percent certain of
success. From 50 percent to 100
percent. I'm asking you, is that
good?

If you can increase your
chances that much on all of
your tough plays, I am willing
to go out on a limb and say
that you will do all right. Even
my friend Mr. Meek would be
willing to make that statement.

Mr. Abel opened the queen of
diamonds and Mr. Masters won
with the king. He laid down a
small club. Mr. Abel ducked and
dummy's king won. A small club
was led to the 10 spot and Mr.
Abel took the ace.

Now the jack of diamonds was
won in the closed hand with the
ace. Here Mr. Dale showed out.

of clubs to the dummy's jack,
Mr. Dale showed out of that
suit too. Thus it was clear that
Mr. Abel had started with five
diamonds and four clubs.

Instead of taking the heart
finesse at this point, Mr. Masters
led a spade back to his king—
and Mr. Abel discarded a small
heart. That gave the complete
picture of Mr. Abel's hand.

Now Mr. Masters laid down his
last club and then led his small
diamond. Mr. Abel won and
cashed two more diamond tricks.
But that was the end. His last
two cards were the king and
nine of hearts and he had to
lead into Mr. Masters ace-queen.
