Rupert Artist Is Acclaimed

Victor Amadio Making Good in Los Angeles

Prince Rupert-born Victor Amadio, son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Amadio, Sixth Avenue West, is making good in a big way in professional art in Los Angeles where he has his own commercial office.

Especially talent, which was at first displayed in school days, was developed at art schools in Vancouver, Oakland and Los Angeles. Recently it received recognition in the press following an exhibition at Esther's Alley Gallery in Los Angeles.

Writes Kay English, art editor of Los Angeles Examiner: "Holding the spotlight at Esther's Alley Gallery is the first one man show by an artist who signs himself Amadio."

"Born 27 years ago in Canada, Victor Amadio's first exhibit shows he possesses a most unusual talent and I am sure you will agree when you see his colorful oils and water colors, views of Los Angeles, Paris and San Francisco.

"Already Amadio's work hangs in many important private collections. His water colors show he has full command of the media as well as the ability to portray what he sees. There is a Viennese quality in his beautiful composed oils that is notable."

Depth Sounders For Fish Fleet

Prince Rupert's fishing fleet continues to go modern and the emphasis now is on depth-sounding equipment which has proven such a boon to the halibut fishery.

At the moment there is a rush to get in such equipment before scarcity develops owing to the defence demand.

One local waterfront electrical concern reports installing five depth sounders in recent days.

Fifteen new combination gill-nets and halibut boats, being built for Sunnyside cannery will be equipped with depth sounders.
