Boat Repair and Building Industries.

The increase of the fishing fleet at this point has led to a great deal of activity among those who do business with the fishermen. Not only are there improved facilities for doing electrical work and an increase in the number of firms doing business along that line, but the boat repair firms and machinists are also increasing in number and in the efficiency of their plant.

Yesterday announcement was made of a new marine ways which is to be erected at Shawatlans Passage alongside the site for the new government dock. It is to be used for handling such boats as are considered too small for the drydock.

Those who have been around the waterfront must have noticed the large number of new boats that are being built at this port. Some of them are fine craft. The boat building industry is just in its infancy. There should be many small vessels built here especially for the fishing industry.
