WAS ON WRECK OF STEAMER B.X.

W. J. Pittman had interesting Experience on Fraser River When Going to Quesnel.

A Prince Rupert man, W. J. Pittman, of the Prince Rupert Music Store, was aboard the river steamer B. X. when she touched a rock on the Fraser River and had to be beached and later went to the bottom. He arrived home last night and talked interestingly of his experience.

Mr. Pittman said that there were only four passengers aboard the big stern wheeler at the time of the mishap. She was loaded down with freight, however, chiefly cement, and that seemed to be the cause of the trouble. The boat was carrying freight for the bridge work on the P. G. E. The rock was submerged and she simply skimmed over it, touching several times and knocking gently. She continued her voyage as if nothing had happened and had proceeded something like a mile when one of the men reported to the captain that she was settling down. At once her nose was put ashore and she was run on the beach. There she swung around and after some of the more valuable part of the cargo had been discharged she settled down and sank.

With Captain Brown and the purser, Mr. Pittman rowed down the river sixty miles in a boat to Quesnel and the captain returned to Prince George in an automobile and secured a launch to take away the rest of the crew and the other passengers. Mr. Pittman spent a week in Quesnel and then returned to Prince George in a launch. He says that the owners of the steamer have put the Express, another large stern wheeler, into the water and will operate her for the rest of the season.
