Rangers Rout Black Hawks

NEW YORK (CP)—New York Rangers burst out with their scoring spree of the sea- Wednesday night as they routed Chicago Black Hawks at Madison Square Garden into a three-way tie for place in the National Hockey League.

The defeat dumped Black Hawks back into last place, a point behind the Rangers, Bruins and Montreal Canadiens.

Goalenders were brilliant. Chuck Rayner making great saves in the New York net and Harry Lumley shining brilliantly for Chicago, playing with an

injured left knee, had 36 saves compared to 22 for Rayner.

Chicago outscored the Rangers in the middle frame, Bill Mosienko and Bill Gadsby beating Chuck Rayner clearly while Nick Mickoski got one for New York to leave the game tied 3-3 as the third period started.

New Zealand's New Race Horse

AUCKLAND, N.Z. (CP)—New Zealand has produced a race-horse which sportsmen here believe may pile up a record comparable with any of the turf giants of the past.

Mainbrace, a chestnut horse, has won 17 races in a row, including two starts as a four-year-old this season. Since he was a two-year-old he has started 25 times, winning 23 races, with one second and one third. He won 15 races as a three-year-old.

The Australian and New Zealand record of consecutive wins is 19, held jointly by two famous champions of the past, Gloaming and Desert Gold. Mainbrace has already beaten the records of Bernborough, 15 wins in succession, and Par Lap, who had 14, and these two were the greatest racehorses of modern times in the two southern Dominions.

His stake earnings to date total \$86,950, but purses here don't compare with the North American or British tracks. His latest win was noteworthy in that he covered 1 1/2 miles with a slight leg injury.

George Vezina, reputed the greatest hockey goalie of all time, played his last game for Montreal Canadiens 26 years ago at Montreal. With a temperature of 103, he finally collapsed in the net and was taken home to Chicoutimi where he died four months later in 1926.

Three bribery attempts were reported by Scottish players last week.

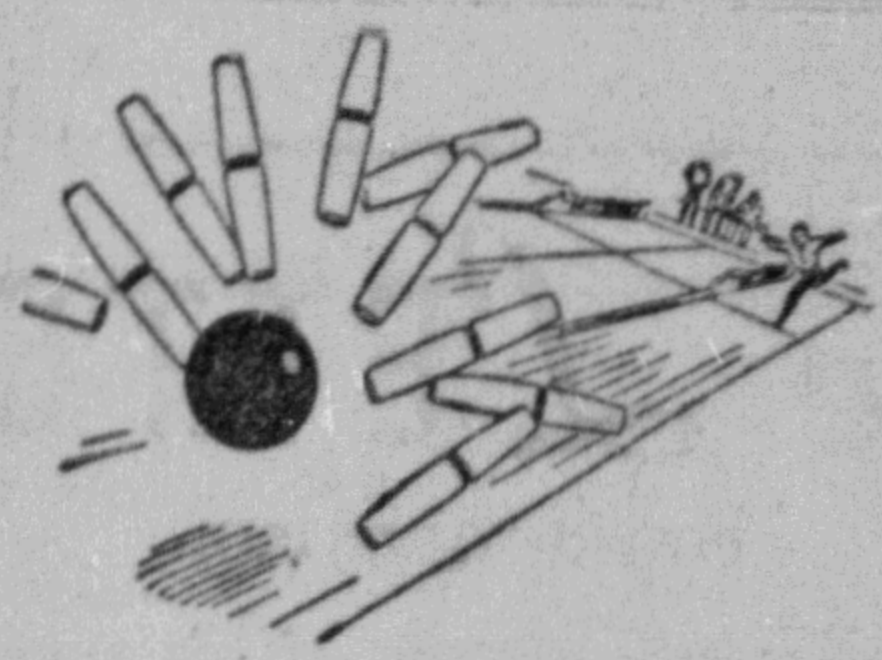
Kid Gavilan, Bratton Draw
