Sport Briefs

Joey Ray of the Chicago A. C.  
beat the Canadian one mile record  
in winning the one mile handicap  
race at the Toronto Exhibition  
grounds last Saturday in four  
minutes and two fifths seconds.  
The best previous Canadian rec-  
ord was four minutes and twenty  
seconds. The world's record is  
four minutes twelve and three-  
fifths seconds. In the mile bicycle  
race Norman Webster of Alberta  
was fourth.

Four teams, Regina, Moose  
Jaw, Saskatoon and University of  
Saskatchewan, will comprise the  
senior league in the Saskatchewan  
rugby football union this year.  
The first games are scheduled for  
September 27th when Regina  
plays at Moose Jaw and Saska-  
toon at the University. The sea-  
son ends November 1. J. E. Arm-  
strong is president of the union  
and Bert Scott is secretary.

The Edmonton city and district  
football association have asked  
the City Council for a special  
football ground which will be  
known as the Municipal Football  
Field. It has also been asked  
that the Council should assist the  
amateur associations as they are  
not self supporting. In this way  
young players would be encour-  
aged to take up the healthy sport  
if accommodation is furnished for  
the convenience of those taking  
part.

There was no football game  
last evening between the Sons of  
England and the Grand Trunks.  
Only a few of the members of the  
latter team showed up at the  
grounds and there was no referee  
appointed by the association.  
Report was current down town  
that the match had been post-  
poned as both teams had signified  
that they were unable to field the  
full number of players.

Yesterday afternoon there was  
a meeting of the junior boys at  
the King Edward School for the  
purpose of reorganizing the Bea-  
ver baseball team for the fall  
months. Miss Mills of the teach-
