Official of Blind Here
To pay a visit to the Prince Rupert branch, help arrange for the annual campaign funds and interview local blind people, Harold Guest, field secretary of the Canadian Institute for the Blind, who is himself 90 per cent blind, has been a visitor in the city the past couple of days. He arrived Tuesday night from Prince George after having visited the Yukon where he organized three branches—at Dawson, Whitehorse and Mayo.
There are quite a number of blind people in the Yukon including natives and several of the old sourdoughs who find haven in the Home for the Aged which is conducted by the Sisters of St. Anne in the old Government Mansion at Dawson.
Mr. Guest lunched with the local branch of the Canadian Institute for the Blind yesterday, meeting the president, Miss Margaret McLeod, and other executive members. The annual campaign will be held here between September 1 and October 15.
Among beneficiaries of the Institute for the Blind have been August Olsen of Prince Rupert and Mrs. Olive Risch of Stewart who have received treatment in Vancouver and Miss Helen Astoria and Miss Irene York who have been attending the school for the blind in Vancouver and are now home on vacation.
While here Mr. Guest visited local blind cases in company with Miss Joan Vivian of the Welfare Department. He left for Vancouver today by air.
