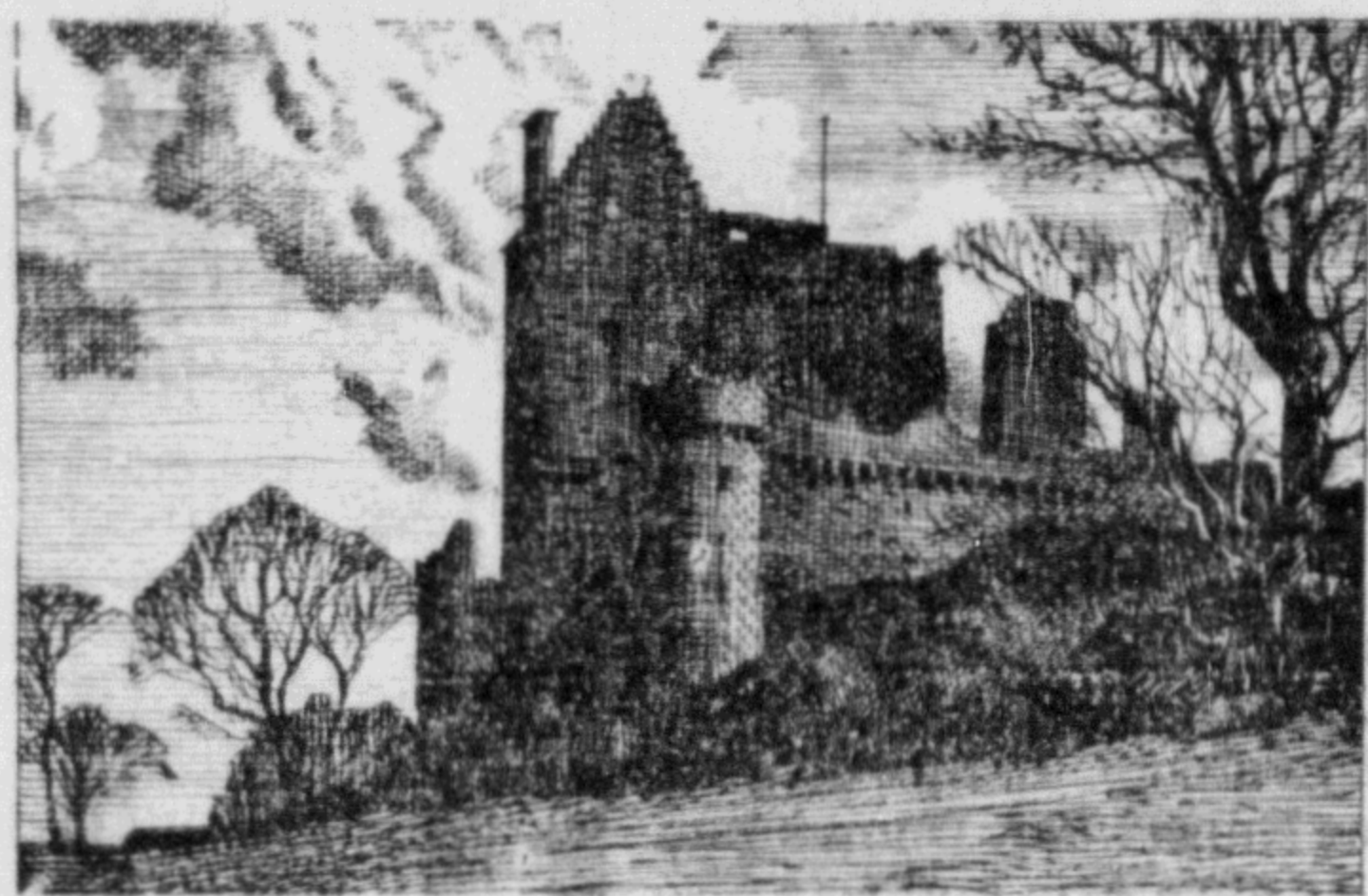

Blackwood on Bridge

Make a careful note of the principle involved in the play of this hand. Its use will improve your game materially.

Mr. Champion opened the king of clubs and, when he saw the dummy, shifted to a trump. Now Mr. Masters saw that he was bound to lose two clubs and one diamond. If he could successfully finesse the queen of hearts he would have 10 tricks. One way to play the hand, then, was to take three rounds of trumps ending on the board and then to lead a heart and put in the queen if Mrs. Keen played low.

But Mr. Masters figured it like this. The heart finesse was a 50-50 proposition. Therefore, any other line of play for the tenth trick (however remote its chance for success would increase the odds in Mr. Masters' favor. In other words, the heart finesse could always be taken as a last resort.

So Mr. Masters won the second trick on the board with the queen of spades and led the trey of diamonds. Mrs. Keen ducked and the queen in the closed hand

won the trick. A small diamond was returned and Mr. Champion craftily went up with the 10. But Mr. Masters played the five from dummy and the 10 held the trick.

Mr. Champion led another trump which dummy's jack won. Mr. Masters was delighted to see that the opposing trumps broke 2-2. His next lead was the nine of diamonds from the board and Mrs. Keen had to play the ace. Mr. Masters ruffed and led his 10 of clubs. Mr. Champion took this with the ace and got out with a club.

Although Mr. Masters' queen of clubs was good, he ruffed it on the board with the deuce of spades so that he could lead the king of diamonds and discard his queen of hearts. Thus he made his contract without risking the heart finesse. And as you see, the finesse would have lost.

BATTER UP

All baseball seems to be up in arms in Prince Rupert today, while decision is awaited of a protest placed by Stan Cornwell, manager of Gordon & Anderson, to Commissioner William Gordon.

Cornwell is protesting the first game of the semi-final playoffs between Gordon & Anderson and Commercial's Thursday night. Beef concerns baulking of illegal pitching delivery claimed on Commercial's chucker, Ray Zaccarilli which, if called by Umpire-in-Chief Alex Bill, would have advanced a runner on third base to home plate, thus tying the game.

Here is Cornwell's letter to the commissioner:
Re: Semi-final playoff between Gordon & Anderson and Commercial's, Aug. 16, 1951.

"The Gordon & Anderson Baseball Club and management wish to place the above noted game under protest for illegal pitching which, with two men on bases (second and third) the opposing pitcher was pitching illegal pitches and time was called with the Umpire-in-Chief instructed of the illegal pitch (which if called would be a balk ball advancing all base runners) but the Umpire-in-Chief informed those concerned that the pitch was legal. We would like to draw to your attention Rule 801, Legal Pitching Delivery of the Official Baseball Rules, revised 1951 published by the National Baseball Congress of America which states as follows:

"After assuming a 'set' position which is—Set position shall be indicated by the pitcher when he stands facing the batter with his entire pivot foot on, or in front of, and in contact with, and not off the end of the pitcher's plate, and his other foot in front of the pitcher's plate, holding the ball in both hands in front of his body and coming to a complete stop of at least one second. From such set position he may deliver the ball to the batter, throw to a base or step backward off the pitcher's plate with his pivot foot. BEFORE assuming set position the pitcher may elect to make any natural preliminary motion such as that known as 'the stretch.' But if he so elects, he must come to set position before delivering the ball to the batter. AFTER assuming set position, any natural motion associated with his delivery of the ball to the batter commits him to the pitch without alteration or interruption."

"On this rule we place our protest."

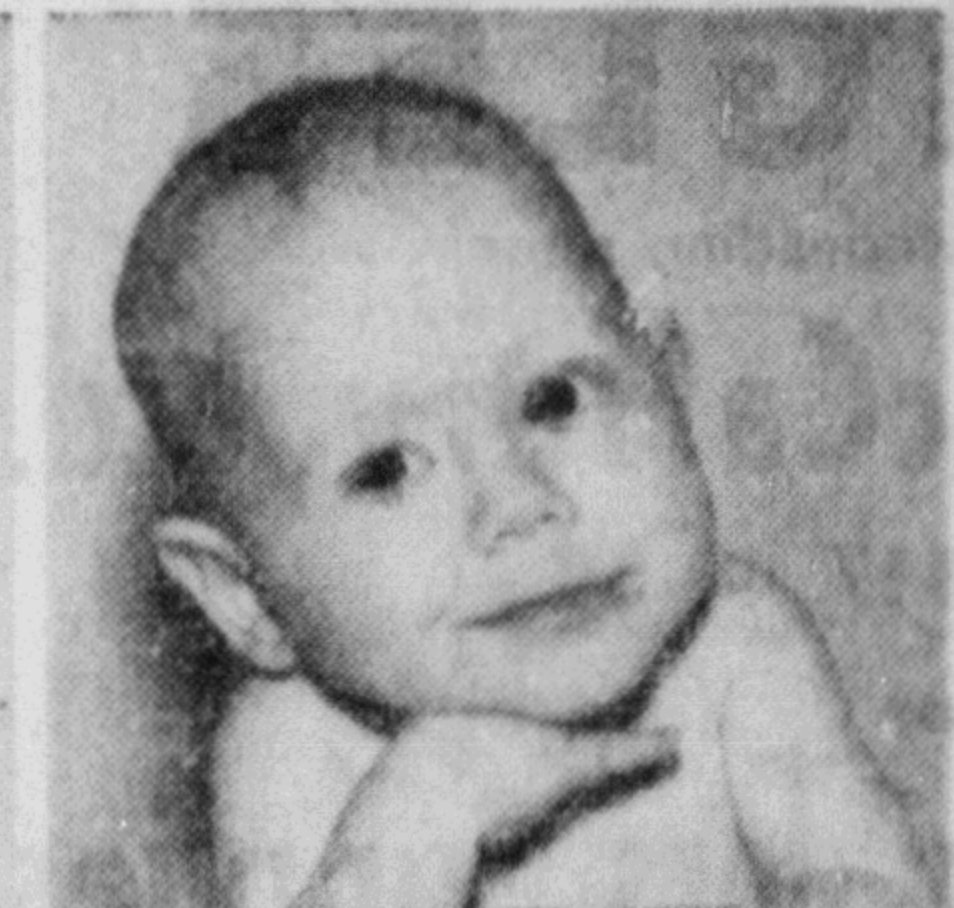
