Is Sentenced For False Pretences

One month from date of arrest was the jail term imposed on Arnold James Henriksen by Magistrate W. D. Vance this morning.

Henriksen pleaded guilty to a charge of false pretences in connection with a worthless cheque he tendered to Chin John of Enterprise Grocery January 30 for payment of an account and \$50 additional.

On behalf of Henriksen, Mrs. Willa Ray asked for leniency on the grounds that her client was only 20 years old, was married and had two children. He had not been in trouble with the police before. Mrs. Ray said he had not realized the seriousness of the offence he was committing and that he had hoped mistakenly to have been able to obtain the money from an uncle in Vancouver. When he found he was not able to obtain the money, he had wired Chin John to ask him to hold the cheque.

Miss Joan Vivian of the social welfare branch corroborated Mrs. Ray's statements concerning Henriksen's family circumstances.

Magistrate W. D. Vance told the youth the charge against him was a very serious one and could bring a sentence up to seven years. "I don't like sending young fellows to jail," he continued. A wife and two children are a great responsibility, he told the young man.

"You don't look like the criminal type," Magistrate Vance said. He said he was going to pronounce a sentence that could be served in Prince Rupert rather than send him south. He suggested Henriksen see Chin John after he had finished serving his sentence and make arrangements for repaying the value of the cheque.

Although he was letting him down easily, Magistrate Vance warned, the sentence would be recorded and would be held against the youth if ever he got in trouble again. He could not expect the same leniency a second time.

Magistrate Vance then pronounced the sentence of one month from the date of arrest, to be served in the Prince Rupert lock-up.
