

CHICAGO ()-Electric power has been produced from atomic energy by United States scientists for the first time, the Atomic Energy Commission said Saturday.

Power-more than 100 kilowatts-was generated and used to operate pumps, reactor equipment, provide lights and electrical facilities at the national reactor testing station
