Blackwood on Bridge

Here is another reason for refusing to take a finesse. It is the case when you want to do everything possible to keep one of your opponents out of the lead.

Look at the apparently sensational guess Mr. Champion made on this hand. Yet it was not a guess at all. It was merely a

Mr. Abel ignored Mr. Dale's opening club bid and opened the king of that suit. It was permitted to win. The queen of clubs followed and Mr. Champion ducked again. He won the third club lead with dummy's ace, discarding a small heart from his hand.

Now he led the jack of diamonds from the board and calmly played the ace, subjecting Mr. Abel's lone king to an inglorious death.

Mr. Champion refused the finesse because he knew if Mr. Abel got the lead the contract was doomed. He was as surprised as anybody at the table when the king dropped. But he had gone up with his ace to guard

against that very contingency.

If it turned out that Mrs. Keen held the king of diamonds, she could win a trick with it—and welcome. Mr. Champion would still have nine winners—four diamonds, one club, one heart and three spades.

As a reward for his thoughtful play, Mr. Champion was able to put a squeeze on the hand and make five-odd. After winning with the ace of diamonds he ran the rest of that suit.

When the last diamond was led Mr. Abel was down to four spades to the jack and the king and one heart. If he let go a heart Mr. Champion would have thrown a spade from dummy and won two heart tricks.

Actually, Mr. Abel discarded a small spade, so Mr. Champion discarded a heart from the board and won the last four tricks in the spade suit.

Hypodermic War Waged Against Deadly Disease

ADDIS ABABA—Veterinarians of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations say rinderpest is a deadly disease which kills more than a million cattle a year. It is particularly serious in Ethiopia, the FAO specialist says, because livestock is one of this country's major economic assets. Ethiopian cattle provide food and draft power at home, and were it not for rinderpest, could be exported abroad to the benefit of this country's economy.

A team of FAO veterinarians and bacteriologists have vaccinated more than half a million animals in the two years FAO's rinderpest control program has been in operation here, as part of FAO's contribution to the UN expanded technical assistance program.

The FAO team estimates that if this mass vaccination program continues through the next three or four years, rinderpest will be completely eradicated.

The latest specialist to join the FAO team here is Dr. Neils Konserup, who received a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from the State College of Washington in 1942 and since then has worked as a veterinarian in five continents. After four years of dairy practice in Washington, he joined the UNRRA staff to accompany livestock shipments to Europe. A later assignment took him to China where he worked with field vaccination teams in the Yangtze River valley and for the first time encountered rinderpest. In Okinawa he helped to set up three veterinary laboratories. His first FAO project, after joining the staff in January 1951, was on the control of foot and mouth disease in Colombia.
