The hand was then played out and as you see Mr. Dale could never make more than eight tricks owing to the unfortunate distribution of the club suit. He won four clubs, two diamonds and two hearts and he was through. However, the two trick penalty for the revoke enabled him to score game—with an extra trick.

Mr. Muzzy really poured it on Mr. Champion. "Oh, I'm so sorry I didn't open a spade, partner," he said with fine sarcasm. "I suppose I should have got one out of the other deck. And incidentally, why didn't you take time out from giving lessons long enough to give yourself a lesson in the simple art of following suit? The hearts are the curly ones like on Valentines and the diamonds are the ones with the sharp edges..."

SMITHERS—A three day cold snap in the Bulkley Valley seemed on the wane today after causing severe damage to water pipes, nerves and hopes for an early spring.

Temperatures ranged as low as 20 below, but were accompanied with biting cold winds up to 30 miles per hour velocity. The combination proved costly in fuel bills and attacked water pipes that had actually come through two other winter cold snaps with colder temperatures.
