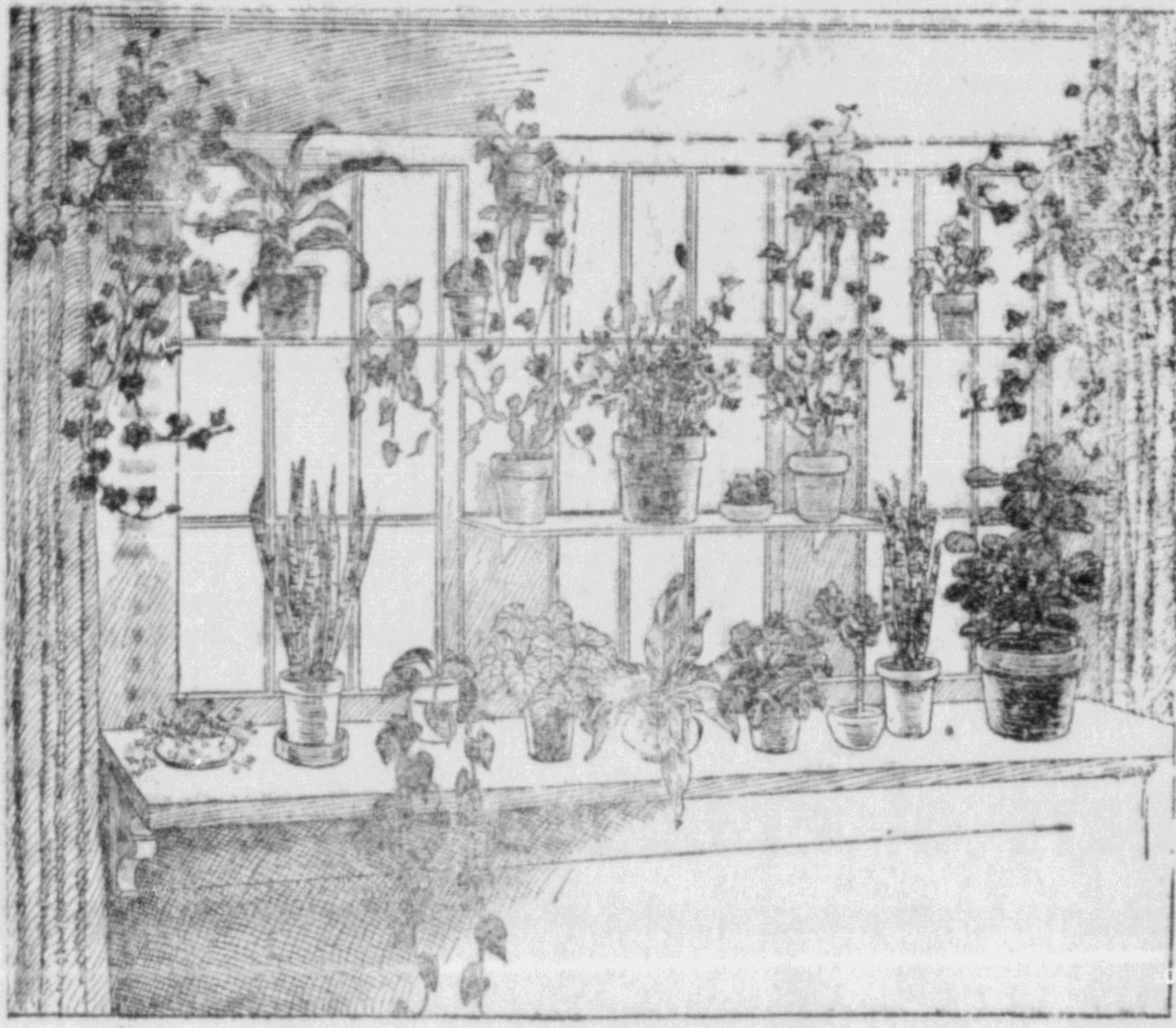

PLANTS IN PICTURE WINDOW
CALL FOR SPECIAL CARE



A Winter Window Garden Makes Spring Come Faster, and Teaches Many Lessons

Popularity of picture windows, have caused some readjustment in the rules for winter window gardens.

A north window of normal proportions has not been considered a good location for flowering plants, because of insufficient light. But a picture window facing north is not shaded from reflected light of the northern sky, is a preferred location for most of the plants which are easy to grow in the house.

The light which such a window admits is adequate and it has the advantage of an even and cool temperature. In a room which varies between 70 and 80 degrees in daylight hours, the temperature close to a north window will often be 10 to 20 degrees lower.

A picture window facing south, on the other hand, which gets the full impact of the winter sun will usually be subject to extreme variations of temperature. If you place a thermometer between a south window, and storm sash, on a sunny day, you may get readings up to 100 degrees, when the outside temperature is below freezing.

East and west picture windows are likely to be more favorable to plants than one facing south, but the northern exposure is even more easily managed, and favors a wide variety of plants. Cyclamen bloom freely in this location and Paper White narcissi do much better than in a sunnier

window, where the temperature range is much greater. Begonias, which may be injured by too much sun do well. It is an ideal spot for African violets, Amaryllis, calla lilies, and all the hardy bulbs will thrive, and of course the foliage plants and florists' green plants.

An arrangement by which a shade or curtain can be lowered between the plants and the glass on sub-zero nights will protect from injurious drafts, provided the window is of the double pane type, or has a tightly fitted storm sash.

Automatic watering for indoor plants will save lots of trouble, and may save your plants. Trays or saucers in which two inches of coarse sand can be placed should be provided. Stand the pot on this sand, and keep water in the sand just below the bottom of the pot. This water will be drawn into the pot as needed to keep the soil moist, without danger of water-logging. Evaporation from the trays will also help humidify the air, which is usually too dry. Other methods of humidifying which may be available will be beneficial.

Those who live with picture windows soon learn that the light, or glare they admit, is not always pleasant. It is easily, and may save your plants. Trays or saucers in which two inches of coarse sand can be placed should be provided. Stand the pot on this sand, and keep water in the sand just below the bottom of the pot. This water will be drawn into the pot as needed to keep the soil moist, without danger of water-logging. Evaporation from the trays will also help humidify the air, which is usually too dry. Readying New Yukon Army Camp

Construction of a new military camp on the Alaska Highway, 165 miles south of the Yukon-Alaska border, is setting the stage for the start of Exercise "Eager Beaver" early in 1952.

Straddling the highway at Silver Creek, Y.T., the camp will house the 500 Canadian and United States Army engineers participating in the 6-month training exercise scheduled to get under way there January 15.

Some 40 Canadian and U.S. officers and men, under command of Major E. D. Taylor of Vancouver, have been on the scene since October 7, rushing completion of the camp. Early preparations are expected to be completed before the main body of Canadian troops arrive at the training area January 3.

Water Money Bylaw Coming

A \$100,000 water system improvement bylaw will be voted on by Prince Rupert electors at the December civic elections. City council Monday night accepted the recommendation of the board of works, headed by Ald. George Casey.

Total cost of the debentures, to be issued on a 20-year serial basis, interest 4½ per cent per annum, includes the following: Reservoir repairs, \$20,000; Seal Cove water main, \$15,500; Section 2 water main, \$9,500; Fourth Avenue West main, \$7,500; Rushbrook Heights main, \$7,000; Mt. Oldfield main replacement, \$5,500, and the "Co-op" water main, \$10,000.

Aldermen agreed that this was "the least we can get away with" in maintaining the city water system.

Engineer Construction Battalion. Working under severe arctic conditions and spring thaws, the troops will test equipment and airstrip construction of field defences, demolitions and cold weather problems. Study of methods and results obtained at the site will affect future planning and operations.

Encroachment Not Condoned

City council will advise owners of Savoy Hotel that the building is encroaching on sidewalk allowance to extent of 70.04 square feet and that this condition cannot be condoned.

Decision was reached by council Tuesday night when it learned no agreement could be made with the owners for indemnities to the city. Municipal Act holds city can enforce removal of encroachment or condone it.

Ald. T. B. Black suggested the city should not condone the condition "in order to protect ourselves." Owners could at any time be forced to remove encroachment from sidewalk limits, maximum of which is 35 feet and minimum .29 feet.

According to verbal information he had received, Superintendent of Works Stewart said contractors rebuilding the hotel had failed to survey the property.

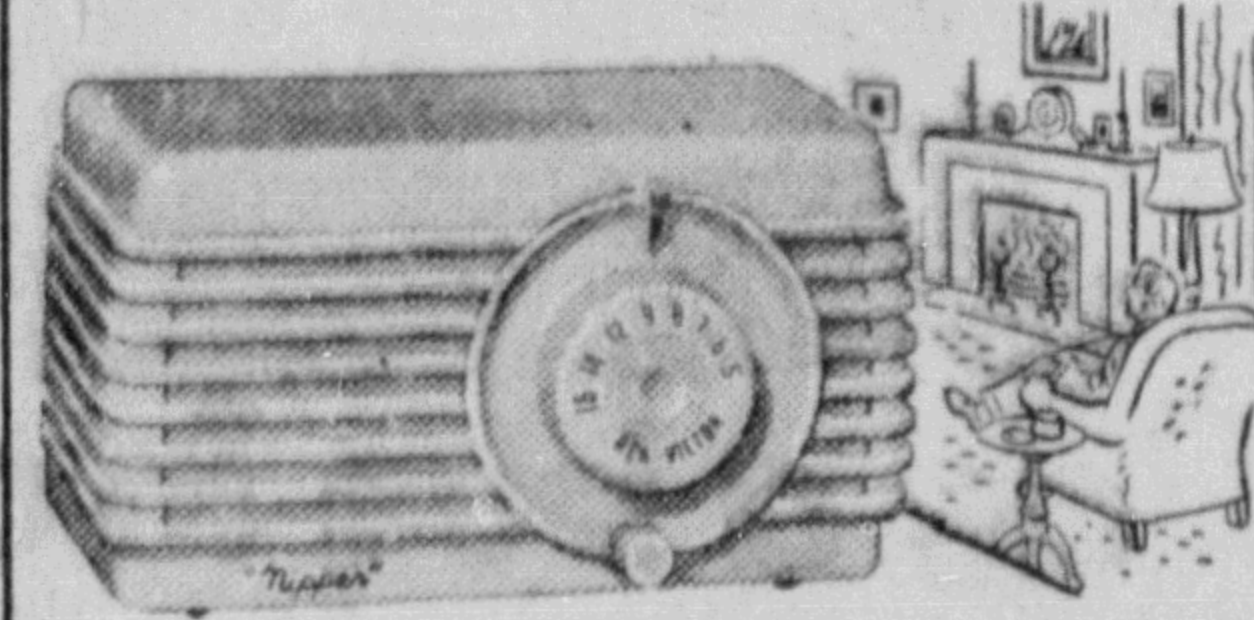
