



# Grain Ship Given Hat

Captain Kunio Mishima, of the Japanese freighter Kiokawa-Maru loading grain here, will be wearing his new hat at "big occasions" back in Japan. It's the hat Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce presented him with Sunday afternoon as a token of welcome.




