More So Than in Canada, Local Lady Thinks—Admires People There.

People of the Old Country appear to be more home-loving than Canadians, says Mrs. R. J. D. Smith who returned to the city a few days ago from an extended visit in Edinburgh with her daughter, Mrs. Stanley Wilson, the former Florence Smith. And Mrs. Smith liked that.

"They are wonderful people," Mrs. Smith tells the Daily News, "considering all they have to go through. Their morale is high. It was all very interesting," she said, "but I really am glad to be home. There is so much contrast between conditions here and there, what with their restrictions and our freedom to have what we like and what we need."

To compare the stores in the Old Country with those in Toronto, for instance, was like being in a different world.

What Mrs. Smith disliked most of all was the coldness of the houses—due to the tight fuel rationing and the fact that so much heating is done by fireplaces. The larger houses are particularly uncomfortable. However, the people seem to get used to it and, as they wear heavier clothing anyway, nobody seems to be suffering greatly.
Mrs. Smith crossed the Atlantic between Montreal and Glasgow, going and coming on the single class liner Laurentian.

Timely RECIPES

Pineapple Juice Tarts
1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1 1/2 cups canned pineapple juice
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup sugar
3 eggs, separated
1 teaspoon grated lemon peel
6 baked and cooled pecan pastry shells
Soften gelatin in 1/4 cup of the cold pineapple juice. Heat remaining juice, lemon juice, salt, and 1/2 cup of the sugar to boiling. Stir in gelatin until dissolved. Beat egg yolks; add a little of the hot mixture and mix well. Combine with remaining hot mixture. Chill until slightly

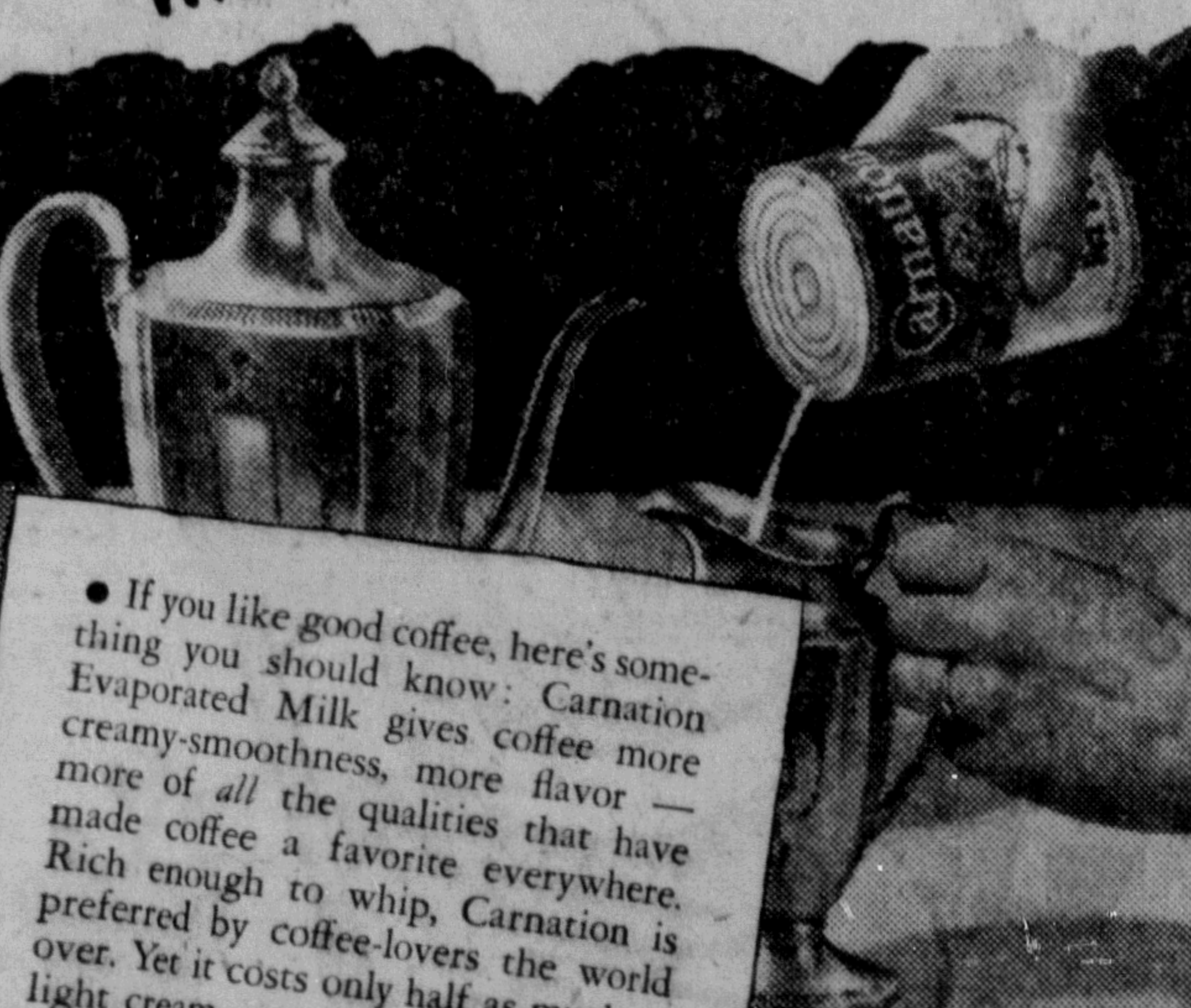

Pecan Pastry Shells—Add 1/4 cup finely chopped pecans to the dry ingredients for 1 recipe of pastry (using 2 cups flour). Or, use a package of your favorite pastry mix. Make into tart shells; prick with a fork. Bake in a very hot oven (450° F.) about 10 minutes.

Clever African Artist Found

PORT ELIZABETH, South Africa.—The story of an African who changed the whole course of an industry in which he was once a laborer was told at the Port Elizabeth agricultural show by an official of the company.

Two years ago 30-year-old Freddie Mputing, an African from the eastern Transvaal, was instrumental in bringing about a radical change in the company's output.

Workmen at the receiving end of a long kiln in which clay insulators were baked from time to time found clay animals hidden under the insulators. Unaware of their real artistic worth they often destroyed them.

One day a Johannesburg artist, Mrs. Marjorie Sangster, saw one of the figures and immediately recognized its value. The unknown artist had hitherto only been sought for the purpose of a reprimand for using company materials and time.

NARROWING THE SEARCH

The search was then instigated for another purpose, and was narrowed down to 20 Africans who were placed in a row and given clay to model.

The natural artist, Freddie, although unwilling to disclose his name because he thought he would be punished was unable to

hide his talent and modeled a perfect figure.
Freddie's talents were given free rein, and he was set to the work he loved. His models of animals, detailed with acute observation, were marketed and instantly created a demand.
Expansion in the ceramic field was started. Five potters were brought from Italy, Holland and England, and the output of glass items a day.
Freddie, who uses no tools but his hands and has had neither lessons nor guidance, continues to model his individualistic figures and critics predict a great future for him.
