RECORD ENTRY LIST—
Music and Drama Festival
Has International Aspect

With over 160 entries, the organizing committee has great hopes for the Music and Drama Festival here May 2, 3 and 4. Entries come from Ketchikan, Aiyansh, Terrace and New Hazelton, with an abundance of participation from the city.

"Last year we had 106 and the large number of entries this year will be a problem—but we are very pleased with the interest shown," said Mrs. E. W. Becker, president of the Music and Drama Association here.

Program convener R. G. Moore is now compiling the program that will adjust the entry schedule.

Because of the heavy program the executive feel that they may have to hold morning adjudication as well as the usual afternoon and evening sessions.

Although the final list has not been completed for publication, city drama entries will include plays from the Girl Guides, Business and Professional Women's Club, Booth Memorial High School and the Little Theatre. Much elocution, pianoforte and dancing will also compete, the president said.

Something different in Prince Rupert entries will be two all-boy choirs that will be included in the program.

Mrs. Becker reports good participation from the schools with five separate entries, including Annunciation School.

From the district there are brass band and the adult St. Peter's Church choir, from Aiyansh; many musical entries from Ketchikan, including violin, cello and a string quartet; a vocal and adult drama entry from Terrace, and vocal and choir entries from New Hazelton.
