with United States embassies abroad.

KNOWS RUSSIA

Four years in Moscow before 1948 gave him opportunity to study the Russian situation and the characteristics of the people. He is convinced that war with Russia is inevitable if for no other than the simple reason that Lenin preached and Stalin has agreed that communism and capitalism cannot live side by side in the world.

"But shooting is only one ultimate phase of Russian aggression," he says. "They are conducting the economic, political and psychological war all the time and that war is now on."

Some such crisis as Korea will develop into full scale war because Russian aggression will have to be stopped somewhere. The western world is not going to submit to a form of communist dictatorship government."

Col. Crockett sees little hope of Russian philosophy being ever adjusted to that of the democracy of the western world. Communism has long since been put over in Russia as a dynamic force—a virtual religion. Its success has depended on the isolation and indoctrination of youth which has been completely accomplished.

There is a system in Russia of universal education but it is completely warped to fit in with the doctrine of communism.

MINORITY CONTROL

Less than four per cent of the people of Russia belong to the Communist party but the party is in complete control as a highly organized and disciplined group, controlling every phase of life, penetrating into the very lives of the people with a ruthless police system of internal spying and speedy "justice."

The standard of living of the Russian people is definitely lower than that of this country but "they produce just as good tanks." And the Russians—men and women alongside each other—work 14 hours a day. Industry and production are concentrated on army and war materials. It is a strictly military economy governed with rigid discipline.

"As a unit, the individual Russian is less efficient than the Canadian or American," says Col. Crockett, "but there are so many more of them, to say nothing of the 20 million slave labor, consisting largely of their own people held as political prisoners."
