Hockey Team In Far North
TORONTO—The Eskimo children of Port Harrison located on the Arctic shores of Hudson Bay, want a hockey team. They have the ice, the climate and the players—but no skates. Such items are hard to come by in this missionary outpost. So the kids took their problem to the Rev. Don Whitebread, the Anglican minister.

Whitebread, a graduate of the University of Saskatchewan, wrote Joe Griffiths, the athletic director, and asked him to locate twelve pairs of skates—for free.

By dint of hard pleading, Griffiths obtained the skates. From Saskatoon to Port Harrison is a distance of approximately 2200 miles but the cost of shipping the skates would be quite prohibitive for a missionary's pay envelope. The public relations office of the Canadian National Railways at Winnipeg was contacted by the university. Would they ship the skates without charge as far as North Bay?

The CNR willingly assented and their public relations office at Toronto telephoned the Ontario Northland Railway to see if they would carry the skates from North Bay to Moosonee. Again the answer was "yes."

But the chain of events went still further. Austin Airways, on one of their four yearly flights to Fort Harrison, were asked if they would fly the skates from Moose Factory. They gladly accepted.

But how to get the skates from Moosonee to Moose Factory, a distance of only four miles? This time the Hudson's Bay Company came forward with an offer to carry the skates by dog team across the frozen Moosonee River. Shipping arrangements completed, the skates left on their northward journey Thursday night.

Who knows but what ten years from now, the Maple Leafs may send a hockey scout to Port Harrison to bring back an Eskimo forward who obtained his start on one of their pairs of skates?
