## Britain is Coal Short

LONDON (CP)—Britain, with her rich resources of unmined coal, has been given a stern warning that unless production is stepped up sharply the country will face another fuel emergency next winter.

The grim reminder of last year's dimout restrictions and power cuts, came from the Industrial and Domestic Consumers' Councils, set up by the government as liaison units between the public and the ministry of fuel and power.

Their separate reports, covering the period to June 30, declare that for some years to come there will be barely enough coal mined to meet growing domestic demands and essential export commitments.

"Unless the improved trend in output resulting from Saturday or overtime working and from rising manpower continues, there is a great danger that the country will be faced with another fuel emergency next winter," says the Industrial Advisory Council.

The report warns this would lead to curtailment of industrial productivity and possibly slacken the pace of the vital rearmaments program. It might also cause further postponement of a return to large-scale exports needed to increase purchases of food and raw materials.

**EMERGENCY IMPORTS**  
 Speedy decision is urged on the question of whether further emergency purchases of coal should be made from the United States and other sources.

"If coal is to be imported," said D. de Bourcier, secretary of the consumer's council, "a decision should be reached quickly so that supplies may be moved to points of consumption before winter sets in and transportation problems arise."

The current gap between production and consumption has widened sharply, he said, with the nation's stockpile standing at about 12,000,000 tons against a target of 18,000,000.

Meanwhile, cancellation of Saturday working and miners' holidays has cut down production while consumption has been booming through increased industrial activity and an annual addition of some 250,000 homes.

"If this trend continues we must make a very serious view of what is going to happen," Mr. de Bourcier said.

### Red Sox and Indians Gain

American League Baseball Race Tightens Up Again With Sensational Play

NEW YORK (CP)—Boston and Cleveland moved into a second-place tie one game behind New York in the steaming American League pennant race Thursday as the Yankees were shut out by Detroit's Hal White and Bob Cain 6 to 0.

The Red Sox manhandled St. Louis Browns twice, 12 to 1 and 11 to 6, in a daytime double-header and the Indians polished off Washington 5 to 2 in a night game featured by a mighty homer by Larry Doby. Doby's blast in the fifth inning, with Dale Mitchell on base, sailed over the 35-foot fence in dead centrefield, 408 feet from the plate.

Chicago White Sox kept in pace, also gaining on the Yanks, by edging Philadelphia A's 4 to 3 on a tenth inning home run by Jim Busby. The win left the White Sox six games behind New York.

The Phillies came from behind to rout Herm Wehmeier and Ken Raffensberger for a 7 to 5 victory at Cincinnati. Raffensberger, 1 to 0 victor of the Phillies Wednesday, was easy this time in a five-run eighth inning.
