**EDUCATION FINGERS STRETCH NORTHWARD**  
The arm of the law is far-reaching, but running a close second are the outstretched fingers of education which in British Columbia leave little to chance and few stones unturned to bring knowledge to children, wherever they may be.  
Take for instance the North coast region, of which Prince Rupert is the hub. The area stretches from Ocean Falls to Stewart and Alice Arm and wherever there are eight to 10 children, there is a schoolhouse. Approximately 2100 children attend these schools.  
In such a scattered area, one might expect to find mostly primitive-type schools, but such is not the case, says Schools Inspector G. W. Graham. The standard of schools is high.  
In the Bella Coola Valley, for example, stands a four-room elementary high school which "compares favorably" with Prince Rupert's new King Edward school. Located at Hagensborg, 12 miles east of Bella Coola and practically in the centre of the valley, 100 students are taught  
In Ocean Falls, a modern addition to the elementary high school will be officially opened by Education Minister W. T. Straith November 9, the day after opening of the new schools in Prince Rupert.  
The modern addition which includes industrial arts and home economic rooms, a gymnasium and classrooms will make the Charleston school a place of which all the students will be proud.  
Charleston, by the way, was renamed this year from Ocean Falls School, in honor of the late Alex Charleston who died recently following more than a decade of service as school board secretary.  
Inspector Graham, who makes a point to visit each school in his district at least twice a year, finds only one major difficulty, "but even that can be turned into fun."  
**TRANSPORTATION DIFFICULTY**  
It's transportation. At many semi-isolated school centres, ships call once a week, at some, less than that. And so the inspector hitches rides on fish-boats, tugboats, hires cabs, takes planes, or a combination of all on a tour to visit schools.  
Schools like those at Namu, Ella Bella and Bella Bella Airport may be out of the way, but fishermen usually sail in and out of these ports quite regularly.  
**MINING CAMPS**  
But in the Portland Canal district—Alice Arm, Stewart or Premier—commercial means of communication call once a week "and it's always a good thing when I get up there," Mr. Graham says. "Five days of it, using both plane and boat."  
Alice Arm school is closed this year, however, for lack of attendance. At Stewart, a superior school teaching 50 children from grades I to XI. At Premier, eight miners' children are taught elementary grades, and at the newly
