Proposal to Lay Macadam on Streets.

There is some doubt whether tar macadam is the best paving for the local streets. It answers very well where the traffic is light but where rain and frost alternate it is almost impossible to keep it solid in the winter. A good deal of repair work is necessary.

In Victoria it has been used with good results on some streets and on others it has been a complete failure.
