Decided on amateur beauty

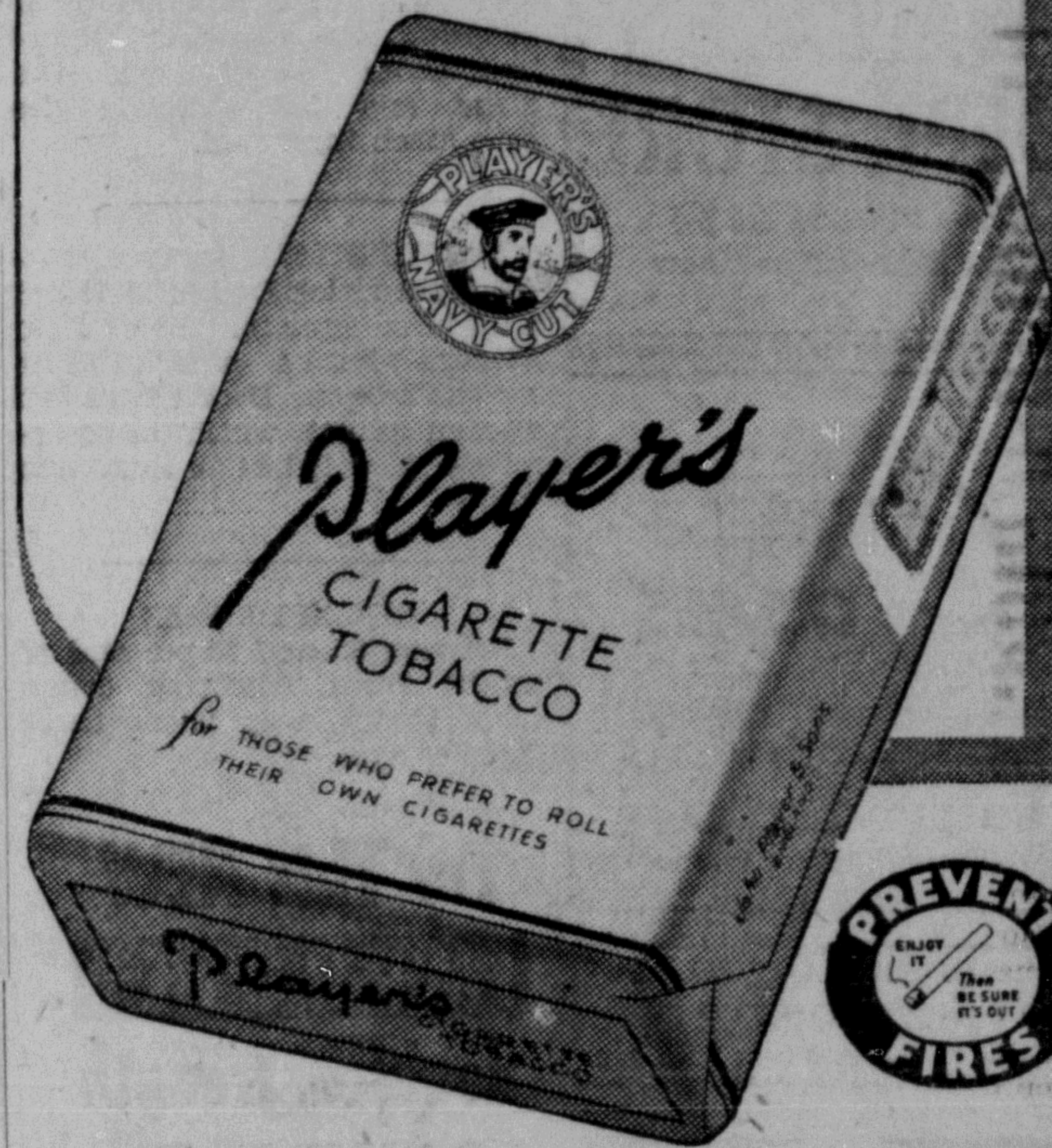

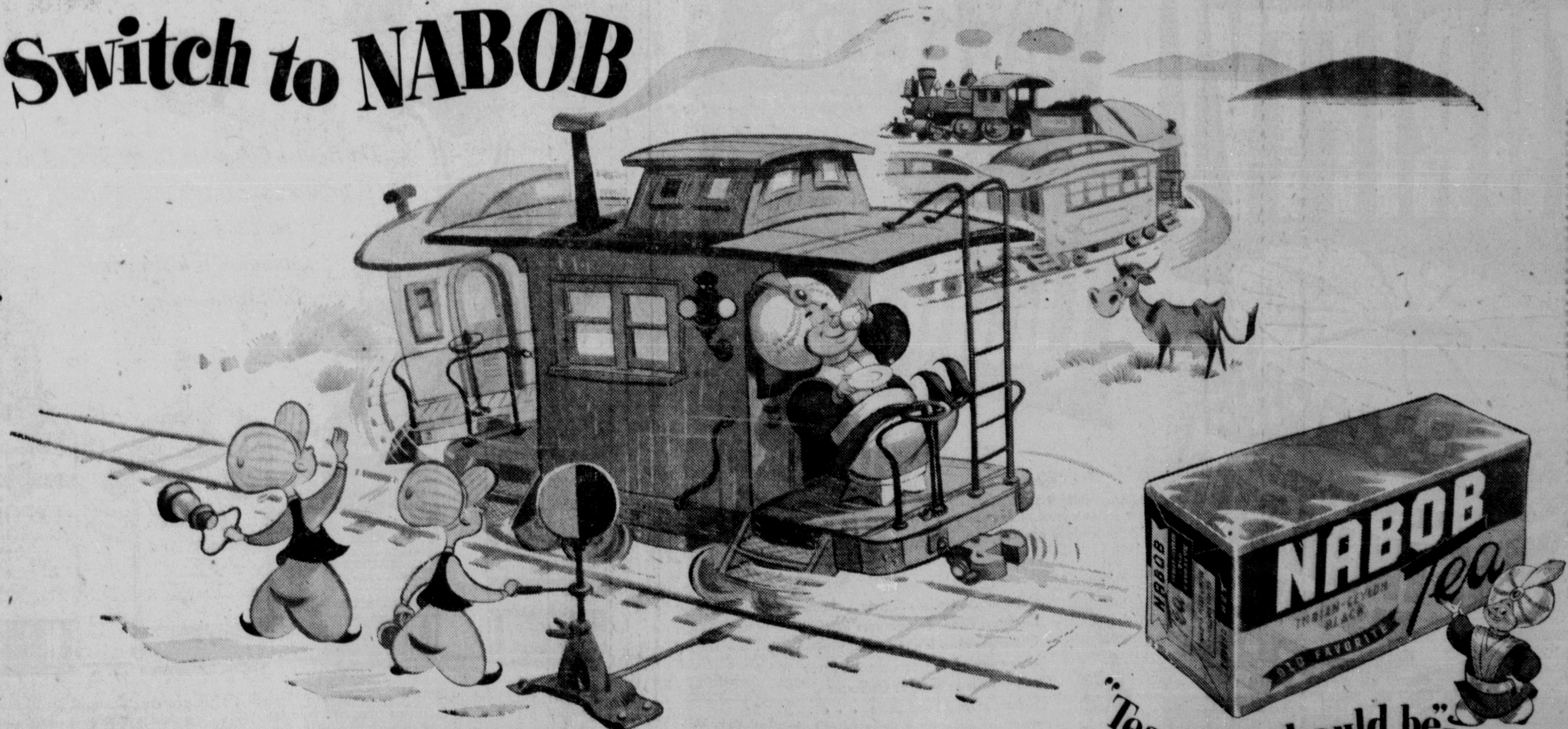
