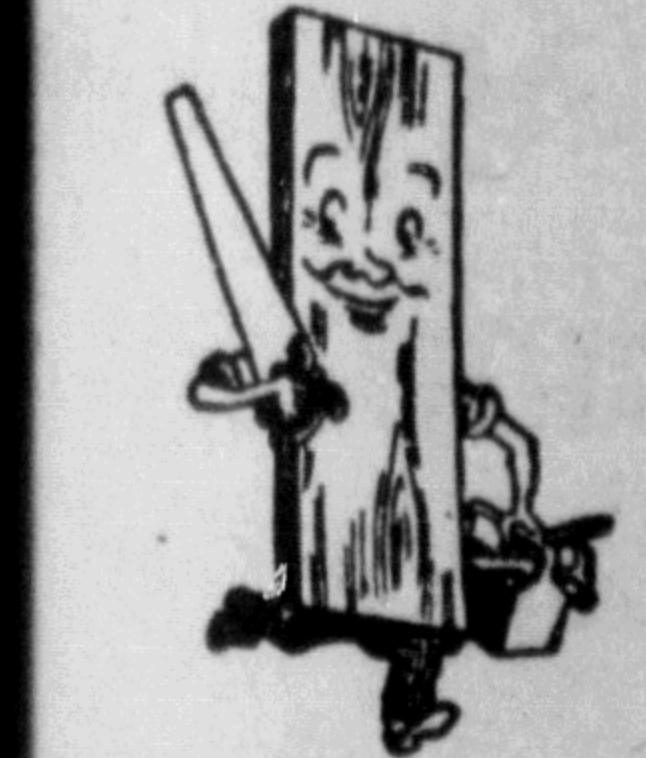

New Freighters For This Coast

Another freighter of the China
coaster type, like the Chilkoat
and Yukon Princess, will be en-
tering the coastal freighting
service in July to be operated
by the Frank Waterhouse Co.
along the British Columbia coast
and to Alaska.

The new ship, called the Blue
Peter, is due on the coast shortly
from the Atlantic and will
promptly go into service.

Another smaller freight vessel,
the Pacific Prince, now under-
going conversion at New West-
minster, is also to go into the
coastal freighting service.

News of these new vessels
coming into service has been re-
ceived by W. J. Scott, president
of the Associated Boards of Trade
of Central British Columbia,
from W. A. Rundle, secretary of
the transportation and customs
bureau of the Vancouver Board
of Trade, who co-operated re-
cently with the Prince Rupert
Chamber of Commerce when it
complained of hold-ups in coastal
freight service.
