## As I See It

### IN HYDERABAD

HYDERABAD, INDIA  
—In Delhi the air is cool as we drive to the airport to take off for the southern part of this vast land. In the dim light of pre-dawn, shadowy figures loom up suddenly, many on bikes, some on foot. All seemed to be wrapped in shawls or blankets.

Our plane takes off, just a few minutes late. But three hours later, when we alight for

a 15-minute stop at Nagpur, the mid-morn sun is so hot it hits us like a blast.

AT HYDERABAD I AM MET by young Ishwar Raj Muthar, who is an information officer of the Indian government.

Raj takes me to my hotel (Percy's, in the suburb, Secunderabad). He is in love with Canada, almost as one loves a girl. For he went up to Canada to work on the Montreal Star and Ottawa Journal to write a thesis on "the press in Canada."

Raj tells me that in his year and a half in Chicago his hand-lady never even offered him a cup of coffee. But in Canada his Ottawa hosts treated him as one of the family. Raj remembers a Saint Patrick's day party at "the Caseys" as one of the great events of his life.

HYDERABAD ITSELF REMINDS me of Victoria, B.C., for the rocky low hills outside Hyderabad are very much the same as those outside Victoria. And in both places the swank, cool homes have been built on those rocky hills.

I sat in one such on my first day in Hyderabad, for I have a motto on this Indian trip: Food first. That is, wherever I go I try to find out as much as I can about how the people eat. Jagjiwan Chand is the managing director of the Hyderabad Co-operative Corporation. This concern acts as government agent in dealing with the whole food situation. It handles the imports, when necessary, and also rations out the scarce foods.

Hyderabad is one of the places severely affected by the present food scarcity in India. It has never been self-sufficient as to food. Also, the people are rice eaters by preference. It is difficult to get them to switch even to wheat eating. Right now Hyderabad has on hand a considerable amount of North American maize, as they call it—that is, corn. But it has been found next-to-impossible to prepare this corn so that the people will eat it, and really like it.

IN LATER ARTICLES, I will report on the Communist-led uprisings in this province. As they have paralyzed production in certain spots, they have naturally affected the local food supply.

IN MR. CHAND'S HOME I admired a fine color print of a painting of Gandhi and Nehru. Gandhi is sitting on the ground clothed only in a loin cloth. Nehru is leaning toward him, as they are laughing at over some joke.

Now I am half ashamed of my enthusiasm for the picture—for my host promptly called a bearer, took down the picture and gave
