## Negotiations With Cellulose

VANCOUVER (CP) - Contract negotiations between International Woodworkers of America and Columbia Cellulose Company of Prince Rupert have run into a jurisdictional snag, union officials said today.

Fred Fieber, secretary of the local, said the union wants the coast contract to apply to all loggers working for the company within a 300-mile radius of Prince Rupert. He said the company wants to split the district into two parts, the coast secgetting the lower interior rate.

Fieber said negotiations likely will not be completed until jurisdiction on the matter has been ironed out.
