**CASCA LOST,  
CREW ARRIVES**

Six Men Out of Twenty-five  
Reach Nome From Famous  
Vessel.

Nome, Alaska, Sept. 24.—The famous little schooner Casca is wrecked and six members of the crew have arrived here.

The vessel made famous by Robert Louis Stevenson sailed with 25 gold seekers to a reputed Galconda on the Lena River, Siberia. She did not reach her destination.

The boat is a seventy ton schooner that was used by Stevenson to sail the south seas. She was borrowed by him from a California millionaire who had built her for racing. Later she was sold and used for smuggling opium and Chinese. She is a sister ship of the Ghost mentioned in Jack London's "Sea Wolf."

**CALLIES WIN  
FROM G. T. P.**

First of the Exhibition Football  
Games Played Last Night on  
Athletic Grounds.

The exhibition cup game last night between the Callies and the G. T. P. resulted in a victory for the mush eaters over their "safety first" opponents. The play was fast and keenly contested and although the Callies had, on the whole, the whip hand, the eager dashes of the trainmen's forwards often spelt danger to a defence which was not quite up to its usual form. Jimmy Mitchell was missing from the Scotsmen's half back line, where his dashing and wholehearted play usually made him a tower of strength in the league games and a big favorite with the football fans. Georgie Abbott made a very capable substitute.

Playing downhill in the first half, the Callies scored through Findlayson and Williscroft. The second half was more evenly contested and each team scored one, the Callies through Tommy Black and the G. T. P. from their inside left.

For the Callies, the most conspicuous forward was Tommy Black. The half back line was well balanced, the backs inclined to be fluky and Jock Clapperton safe in goal. The G. T. P. shown chiefly in defense, Waldorf in goal making many brilliant saves and Smith at back playing a determined game.
