## SALE OF TIMBER

**BELLA COOLA INDIAN RESERVE SEALED TENDERS** addressed to the undersigned and marked on the envelope "Tender for Bella Coola Timber" will be received until 3 p.m. Thursday the 13th day of December, 1951, for the right to cut timber on Bella Coola Indian Reserve No. 1, comprising 3,346 acres in the Coast District, British Columbia. Quantities are estimated at—  
 Cedar—20,000 f.b.m.  
 Fir—16,000,000 f.b.m.  
 Spruce—4,000,000 f.b.m.  
 Cottonwood—4,000,000 f.b.m.  
 The timber sale is subject to the provisions of the Indian Act and Regulations, and to these conditions:—  
 1. Excluded from the timber berth are:  
 (a) Bella Coola Indian Village  
 (b) Triangular wood lot on the south boundary of the Reserve bounded by McKenzie Highway on the north west and Kopas Road on the east.  
 2. Pure stands of birch and alder are not to be cut. These species are to be cut only where intermixed with other species where economic operation requires their removal along with other timber. All other merchantable timber is to be cut. At least 25% of each year's cut is to be cottonwood. Not more than 4,000,000 f.b.m. may be taken in any one licence year.  
 3. All timber is to be scaled on the Indian Reserve. Scale accounts and payment of stumpage are to be delivered monthly by the 20th of each month for all timber cut during the previous month.  
 4. \$30,000.00 is to be paid in advance of the issue of the timber licence against timber dues. This advance dues and must be maintained at not less than \$10,000.00.  
 5. Dues on species other than fir and cedar are fixed at \$5.00 per m. Tenderers shall bid prices of not less than \$10.00 per m. for fir, all grades, and not less than \$6.00 per m. for cedar, all grades.  
 6. Timber licence will be issued to the successful tenderer for the current licence year ending the 30th of April, 1952, renewable annually for five years until the 30th of April, 1957.  
 Each tender must be accompanied by an accepted cheque to the Receiver General of Canada for \$3,660.00, covering licence fee, \$10.00, annual ground rent, \$650.00 and a deposit of \$3,000.00 to ensure the completion of the contract to the satisfaction of the Director.

# Natives Put On Welcome

Victoria Like England for Visit of Elizabeth and Philip

VICTORIA (CP)—At Thunderbird Park here, where totem poles are on display, Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip were greeted Monday afternoon by hundreds of Indians. The natives welcomed the future queen with tribal dances and also with traditional British cheers. Tomtoms throbbed as the natives sang in their own language. They sang the haunting primitive song of welcome among other numbers. Indian women staged tribal dances. They wore white cloaks ornamented with ancient symbols of their people—the thunderbird, the sea serpent, the eagle and the wolf. The men also danced, wearing ancient painted masks. The Princess smiled when two husky warriors, in bear skins, danced the "Wild Man of the Woods" with much shouting and leaping. **BRITISH WELCOME** It was a typical British welcome for royalty in Victoria Monday. Pomp and ceremony and cheers came in the British Columbia legislative building where an official welcome was extended by Premier Byron Johnson. Later the Princess made a broadcast to the Empire in which she told the people "this journey has indeed been a tremendous experience. We hope we will have a chance to return to the west coast before too long has passed." Streets were packed with crowds as the royal pair toured the city. Ivy-covered buildings along the procession route were decorated with bunting and flags for the Princess and Prince Philip. There was another touch of England. It was like an English fall day—at times slightly overcast.

**More Atom Explosions**  
 Both in United States and Russia, White House Says  
 WASHINGTON—A tiny United States atomic explosion, perhaps a Baby A-Bomb, burst over Nevada Monday a few hours before the White House announced that a third atomic explosion had occurred in Russia. Both events were wrapped in secrecy. The Nevada nuclear mass more than six years ago was shot off a tower but the flash of this one was visible for only a tenth of a second or so. However, the presidential secretary, Joseph Short, said the new explosion in Russia was apparently a part of a test series. He did not use the word "bomb" nor would he say when the explosion occurred. His refusal, he added, was based on national interest.
