Like Father Like Son

SOMEWHERE IN KOREA—The Reids, serving with the 25th Canadian Infantry Brigade Ordnance Company in Korea, look alike, speak alike, and probably think alike.

Sergeant-Major Fred O. Reid is with the mobile bath and laundry unit and Private Fred C. Reid, his son, is in the spare parts section of the company.

The two were together once before when Fred Jr. reported to the ordnance company at Fort Lewis, Wash., after joining the Special Force.

Fred Sr., a permanent force man, received quite a kick out of having his son in Ordnance. He tried to get his son into the laundry unit even by calling for him by name, but young Fred moved into the spare parts section.

However, at 18 he was too young and returned to Canada, later joining the Active Force. Then, as he was completing basic training, a call for volunteers came up and he stepped forward.

When they are alone relationship slips into an easy familiar "Dad" and "Son." But when others are present conversation is strictly military.

Hockey, Canada's national game, will find both Reids hanging over a radio or newspaper for the latest game results.

Both have played the game, Fred Sr. with the Army League before the Second World War and young Fred with the junior leagues in his home town.

Recently Fred Sr. came in for a bit of kidding from his son when the mobile bath unit was caught in heavy rains and partly washed away.

"Dad had just finished repairing the washing machines when the flood came," chuckled Fred Jr. "All his work was for nothing."

Young Fred manages to see his father regularly once a week. He rides a ration truck up to the unit which operates near the troops.

"We talk about home, Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario, mostly," said Fred Sr. "I have two daughters and another son. We have lots to talk about."

Strings for Danny Kaye

Zany Danny Kaye turned puppet for one of the big musical scenes in his latest Twentieth Century-Fox Technicolor extravaganza, "On the Riviera," now at the Totem Theatre, in which he co-stars with lovelies Gene Tierney and Corinne Calvet.

Working with a troupe of Jack Cole dancers, Kaye and the crew perform a number entitled, "Popo the Puppet," and actually are suspended by ropes like "Howdy Doody" and "Pinocchio."

Moved in tempo furnished by a ninety-piece orchestra, Danny's actions were controlled by eight puppeteers who employed a system of counter-balance weights to operate the ropes and performers. The routine, seen on the screen for a total of four minutes, was dreamed up by Director Walter Lang who heard Danny humming the tune on the set.

Mrs. Danny Kaye, Sylvia Fine, composed the tune of "Popo the Puppet" originally to entertain their three-year-old daughter, Dena. The prolific Sylvia was

the tunesmith of the songs "On the Riviera," "Happy Ending" and "Rhythm of a New Romance," which also are featured in the film.

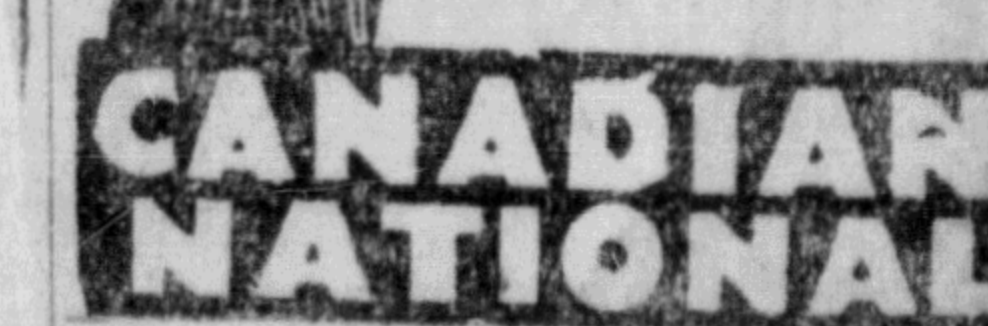
MV Dagny, master Dave L. Mundy, from Ketchikan had three carloads of canned salmon for transshipment over Canadian National Railways to eastern points.
