## Slim Simplicity Fashion Keynote

NEW YORK (AP)—The woman who shops for a new spring outfit this year should consider it as a long-term investment.

Though the silhouette remains substantially unchanged, expectation of new government controls, shortages and restrictions adds interest to the current United States collections, which may represent the public's last chance for a number of years to choose from an unlimited selection of fine fabrics and unrestricted styles.

In general, spring fashions are slim, simple and understated for daytime, with elaboration of line and detail reserved for after-five outfits.

The tailored suit is the most important single item in the new style roundup. The most popular

color is grey, the favorite fabrics flannel, men's wear worsted or lightweight tweed.

Skirts are almost uniformly narrow, often with pleats below the knee in back to give walking room; jackets often are slightly longer than those of last fall with a number of tunic styles making their appearance. The exaggerated curved neckline is out, though waistslines are slightly nipped. Shoulders are slightly padded, but achieve a natural, rounded look. Skirt lengths are slightly shorter than those of last fall.

The suit takes in a wide range this season. It may be the conventional skirt and jacket, or it may turn out to be a sheath dress with matching tailored jacket. Dressier versions, designed for cocktail and theatre wear, often consist of a strapless or low-cut dress and cover-up jacket.

### POPULAR ENSEMBLE

The "suit plus" also makes fa-

shion news. This may be a skirt and jacket with a detachable matching cape, or a dress-jacket outfit with matching long stole. Many of the new suits include a blouse designed to harmonize or contrast with the outfit, with jacket lining to match.

Spring coats lean to high colors in fine fleeces or imported tweeds. The loose, full-cut coat, either full-length, three-quarter or hip-length is the favorite style, though dressier spring coats in navy or black often are fitted.

Sleeve interest is high. The most popular coat sleeve is three-quarter or elbow length, cut wide and loose, with a convertible cuff which may be turned up or down. Balloon sleeves also are new, and are seen on suits and dresses as well as coats. These usually are elbow length and bloused.

Short capes are in evidence in many collections, teaming well (Continued on page 6)
