I am often asked: "How do you keep from getting into a jam using the Blackwood Convention?" The answer is-be sure your earlier bids are correct. Remember that a bad bid, once made, cannot be corrected. You are headed for trouble whether you are showing aces by means of the Blackwood or by means of notes handed to partner under the table.
