In the Letter Box

RE CIVIL SERVICE CLASSIFICATION BILL

Editor the News:

Local Dominion Civil Servants have been advised by their Association Executives that the above mentioned bill is not likely to go through this session as promised by Premier Borden, owing to opposition from the politicians who dislike to find themselves without the influence patronage formerly gave them.

Last year legislation was passed abolishing patronage from the civil service and appointing a Civil Service Commission. The Commission was authorized to employ a firm of experts and to go into a thorough investigation of Civil Service affairs. Their report presented to parliament last spring was embodied into the Civil Service Classification Bill and this bill should have been passed at the spring session.

Owing to pressure of other business, however, it was not brought down, but the different Civil Servants' Associations were promised by Premier Borden that it would be passed at the fall session now sitting.

The bill is important, as while not being what civil servants hoped for, it provides a base to work on. At the present time few civil servants know what salary increases they can expect, as there are no schedules to work on and no man knows where he stands, and is at the mercy of the head of his department. This bill provides for these things in a straightforward manner. The chief objection to the bill from civil servants is the very low range of salaries provided for the rank and file of the service.

However, even with its imperfections the Civil Service as a whole wants this passed into law so that they can know where they are at, and if there does not appear to be a future for them, can try and get into some other business which has better prospects. It would be very unfortunate if this bill is further delayed as there is grave discontent in the service. Especially so in the post office department. It should therefore be pressed forward this session if anyway possible.
