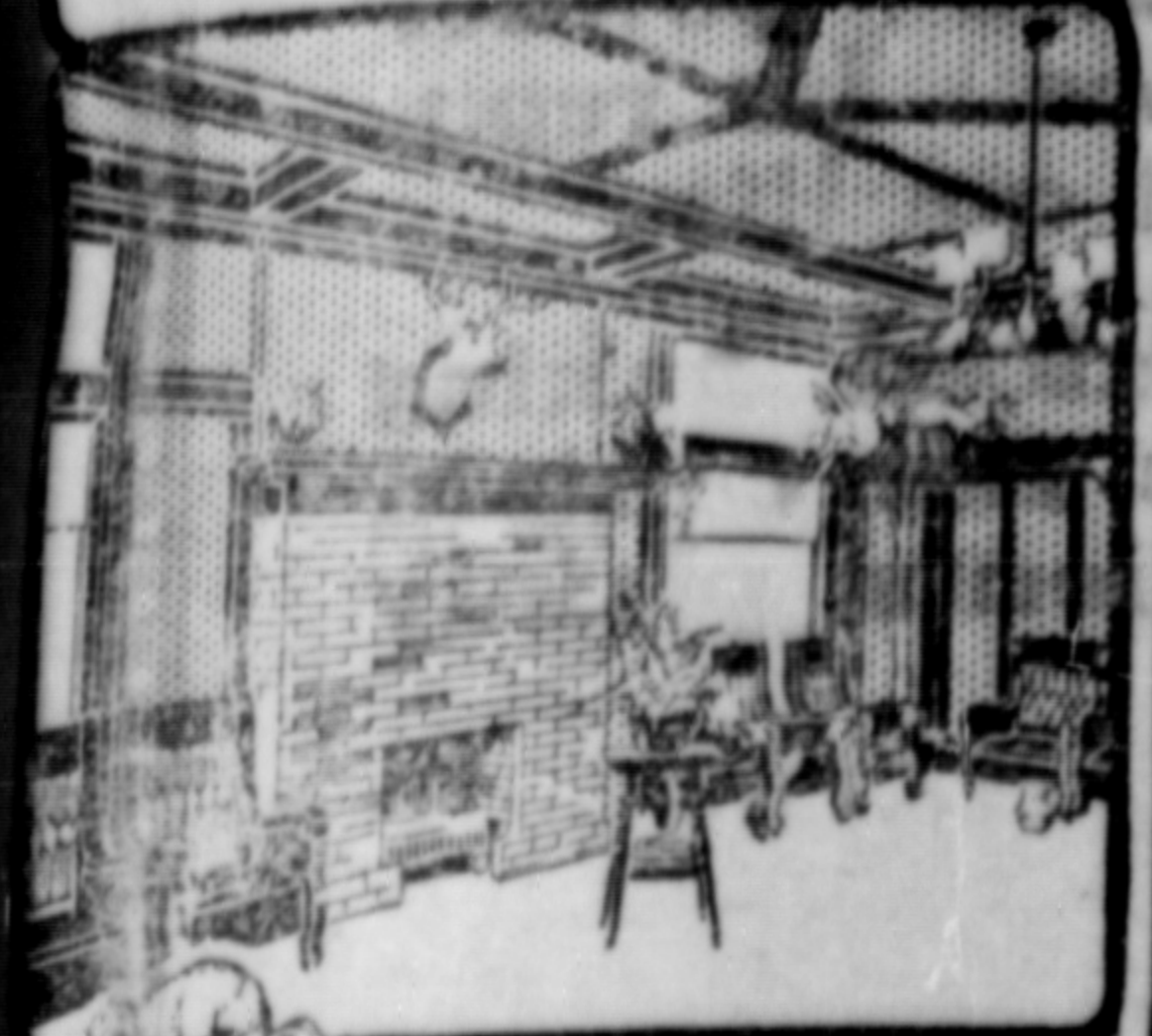

**SEMI-FINAL IS WON BY SONS**

Trail Athletics Beaten After a Strenuous Effort to Withstand Attacks of Englishmen.

The second semi-final for the exhibition cup played last night resulted in a narrow victory for the Sons of England over the Trail Athletics. The game was a rather poor display of football and the Sons were lucky in emerging with the lead. On paper they had the strongest team, but the scratch bunch of athletes who composed the Trail team made up in dash what some of them lacked in football skill and prevented the Englishmen from settling down to their wonted game. Ben Selts men were handicapped by the absence of one of the star players, Harry Day, who is the mainstay of their team. Harry Astoria and Clementson were new men on the football field, although stars in the baseball firmament. Both, however, made a favorable entry in the more rigorous game.

Playing down hill the Sons had most of the attack, which was met by plucky defense and it was not until nearly the end of the half that they scored through the elder Robinson, off a penalty. Malcolm Lamb had foolishly andled the ball in the dread area in a mix-up after a careless bit of play by the Trail goal-keeper. The second half saw the Trail men doing most of the pressing, but time was drawing near ere they equalized with a good effort by Sid Hardy. Sid had apparently been off color, having just previously lost a glorious chance in a solo breakaway, which crime he added to by missing a penalty. Hardy had the echo of the Trail jubilation over goal died when the Sons had regained their lead and soon the final whistle blew.

There were no outstanding personalities in either team last night, the game being too disjointed. George Russell made an efficient referee and kept the game well in hand. Tonight's final between the Callies and the Sons should be a good exhibition of football. It is to be hoped that both teams will maintain the reputation of playing the game which they have earned in previous encounters between the Thistle and the Rose.

Before leaving for Baltimore Cardinal Mercier prepared a little statement, in which he said:—"The American army won the war. General Pershing is a genial leader; to him our respect, to him our universal gratitude."
