Timely RECIPES

MACARONI AND CHEESE

1/2 cup dripping
Medium-sized onion
1 cup powdered skim milk
4 tablespoons flour
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
2 1/2 cups canned tomatoes
Dash of pepper
1/2 lb. macaroni
1 cup grated cheese
Cook onions in dripping until tender and lightly browned. Mix powdered skim milk, flour, salt and pepper. Blend into fat and onions. Add tomatoes and water. Blend well. Cook until thickened. Add the cooked macaroni and cheese. Cook until cheese is melted. Makes about six servings.

... HOUSEKEEPING ...

NOW IS TIME FOR MAKING PICKLES AND RELISHES

Now is the season for pickles and relishes so Mrs. Housewife should start to prepare her winter store. Home economists have sent us three new recipes for pickles and relishes.

PICKLED ONIONS

2 quarts small white onions
8 cups cold water
1/2 cup salt
4 cups white vinegar
1 cup white sugar
1 stick cinnamon
Cover onions with boiling water, let stand 2 to 3 minutes, drain, cover with cold water and peel. Make a brine of the water and salt. Pour over onions and let stand overnight. Drain, rinse thoroughly with cold water and drain again. Pack into sealers. Heat vinegar, sugar and cinnamon to boiling point, boil 5 minutes and remove cinnamon. Fill sealers with boiling syrup and seal. Yield: 2 quarts.

NOTE—If a more spicy flavor is desired, one chili pepper may be added to the above recipe, removing the pepper with the cinnamon.

In place of the cinnamon and chili pepper, 2 tablespoons of mixed pickling spice may be used. Tie these loosely in a small fine

cheesecloth bag, boil with vinegar and sugar and remove before pouring syrup over the onions.

RAW CUCUMBER RELISH

8 cups chopped cucumbers, (6 large)
1 tablespoon salt
1 1/4 cups white vinegar
1/4 cup sugar
2/3 cup sugar
1/2-3/4 teaspoon white pepper.
Peel cucumbers, cut into quarters and remove seeds. Chop finely or put through coarse grinder. Add chopped onion and salt. Mix well, place in colander and allow to drain thoroughly. Bring vinegar, water and sugar to boil and stir until sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat, add pepper and drained vegetables. Blend well, pack into sterilized sealers and seal. Do not use for at least one month. Yield: 40 ounces.

BEEF RELISH

4 cups cooked finely chopped beefs
4 cups finely chopped cabbage
1/2 sweet red pepper
1/2 cup grated horseradish
1 teaspoon salt
1/16 teaspoon pepper

1 cup vinegar
1 cup water

Combine beets, cabbage, sweet red pepper, horseradish, salt, pepper and sugar. Heat vinegar and water to boiling point. Add to first mixture and mix thoroughly. Pack into hot sterilized jars and seal. Yield: about 8 cups.

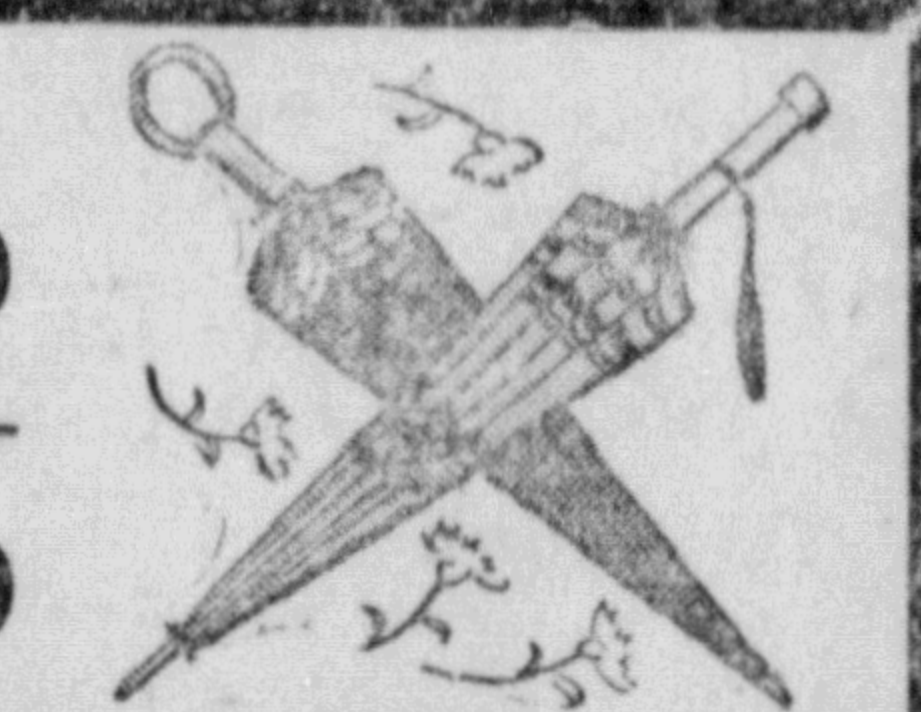
