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Rangers Pilot Resigns; Cook Takes Over

NEW YORK (CP)—Neil Colville, silver-haired veteran of 14 years in the National Hockey League, resigned Thursday as coach of the New York Rangers and was replaced by Bill Cook, one of the all-time great right-wingers.

Colville, 37-year-old native of Edmonton, announced at a press conference here he was quitting because of Rangers' poor showing this season. They are in last place and have lost three straight. He added that his health was another factor.
