My friend Mrs. Keen came up with a beautiful safety play on this hand to nullify some nice defensive play by Mr. Champion.

Mr. Abel opened the king of clubs and alert Mr. Champion overtook with the ace and led back his trey of diamonds. Mrs. Keen figured the diamond must be a singleton and her chances looked bleak indeed.

She could see herself losing two clubs, one heart and a diamond ruff. But she found a way out. Can you see it?

It was obvious that if Mr. Abel ever got the lead, he would return a diamond for his partner to ruff. It was also clear that if and when Mr. Champion got the lead, he would put Mr. Abel in with a club.

Of course, if Mr. Abel held the ace of hearts there was no way

to shut him out. However, if Mr. Champion held that card and the jack of spades as well...

Mrs. Keen saw the winning play. At the second trick she took Mr. Abel's jack of diamonds with dummy's ace. She cashed dummy's king of spades.

She continued with the queen of spades and overtook it with her ace—the only quick way to re-enter her own hand. Then she led the ten of spades and discarded the last club from the board.

With that play went Mr. Champion's last chance of putting his partner in the lead. The club suit represented the only means of communication and now dummy was out of clubs—and had plenty of trumps.

Technically there was still one danger in the hand—the danger that Mr. Abel had the ace of hearts. Actually, however, the danger was past. Mrs. Keen knew Mr. Champion had that card. She could tell by the sour expression on his face.

Desperately Mr. Champion underled his ace of hearts on the long chance that Mr. Abel had the king since without that card Mrs. Keen wouldn't have had an opening bid.

But Mrs. Keen won this trick with the 10 of hearts, drove out Mr. Champion's ace and spread the hand. Mr. Champion won tricks with the ace of clubs, the ace of hearts and the jack of spades.

These were not enough to defeat the contract and even Mr. Champion had to admit that Mrs. Keen had made the safety play of the week.

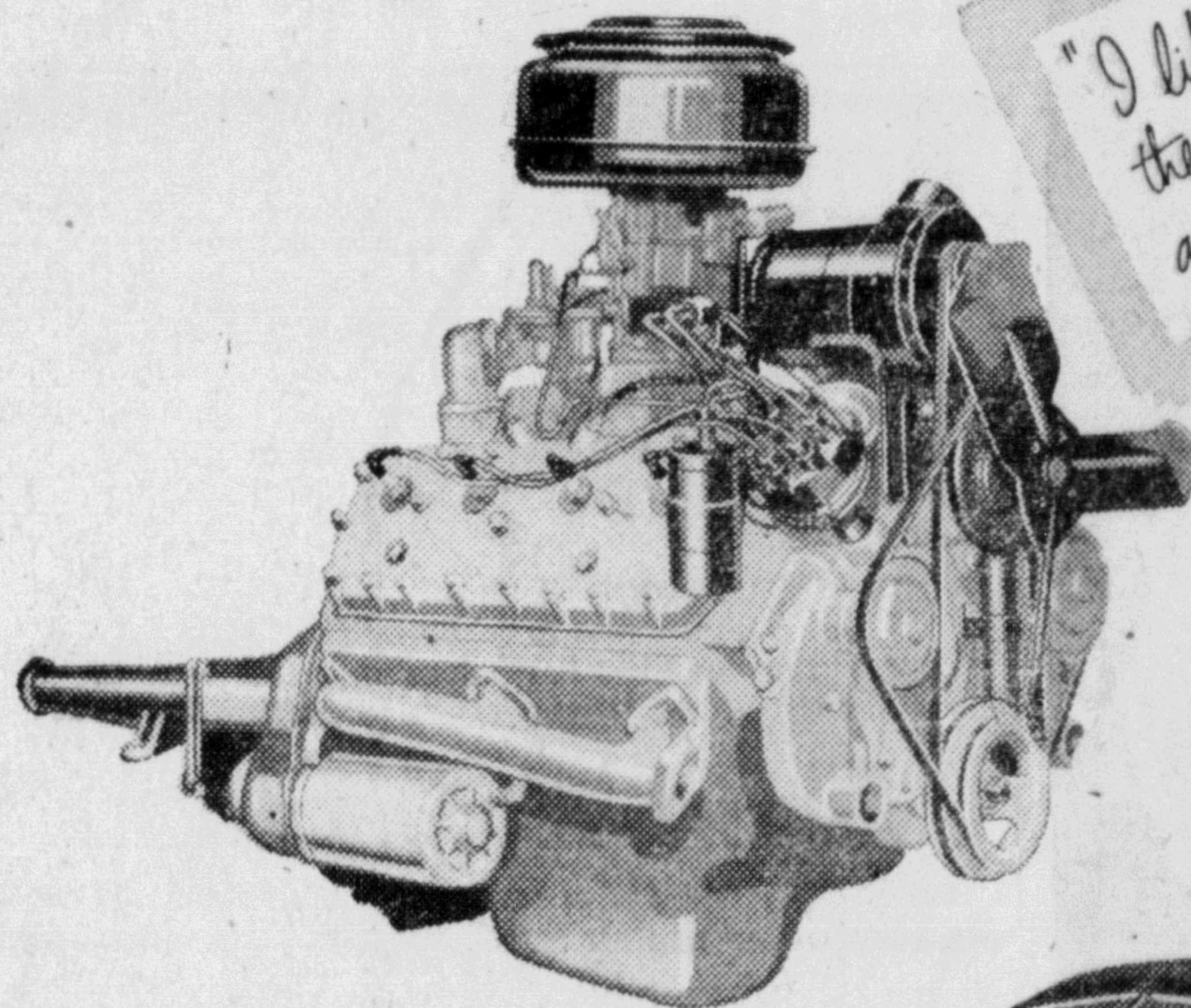

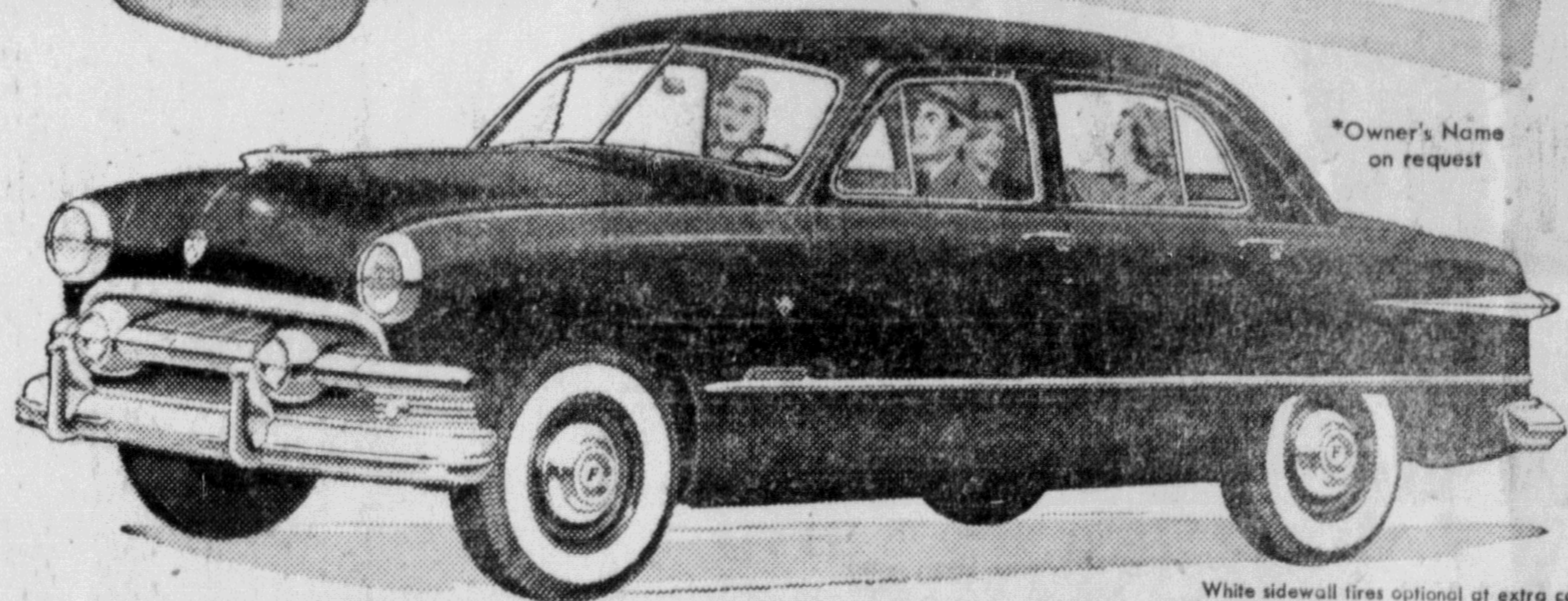

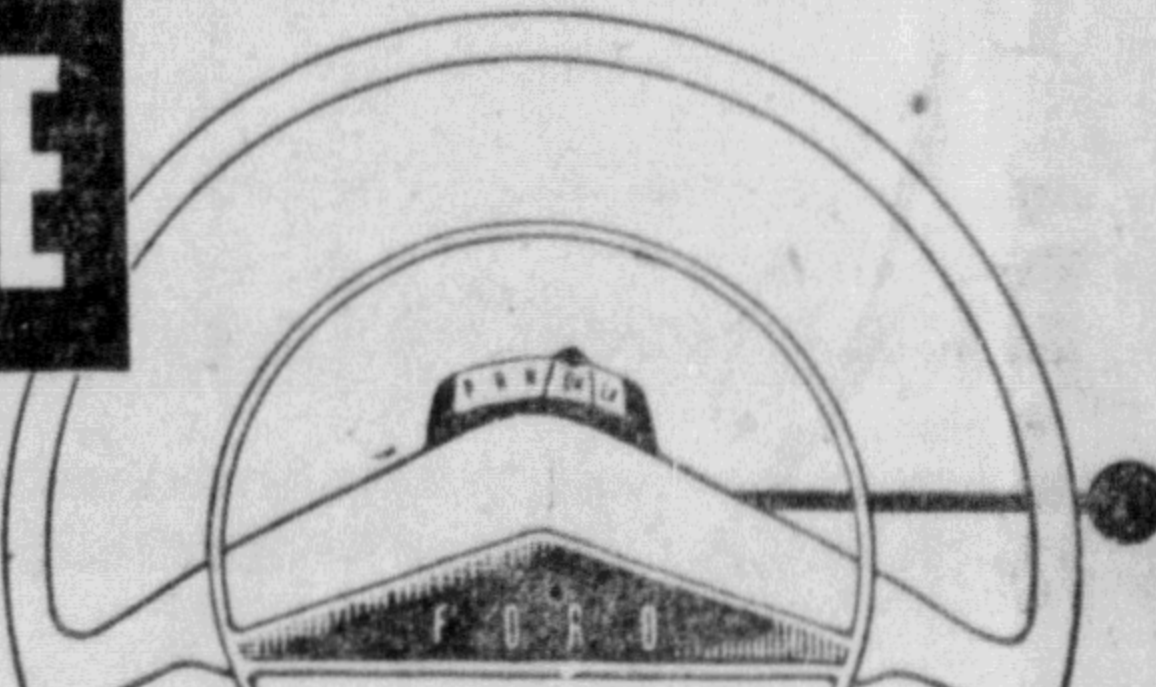
