Soap Box To Plane

Arthur Parent wants to win the Soap-Box Derby because he wants to fly. Arthur has never been up in a plane and it's something he has dreamed about "for years," he says explaining that building his soap-box car "is only a step" to building better planes.

But Arthur is intensely interested in anything mechanical and for months before he knew he was going to be in the Derby had drawn plans of a car which he feels "is likely to win if I can handle it."

He has built the car to maximum proportions as laid out in the official rule book, but hasn't had a chance to try it yet. He thinks tomorrow will be the day. He's been working steadily on it since June 7, and all that is needed to complete the job is a coat of paint, and the test run.

The youthful mechanic, just turned 14, was happy yesterday for he passed Grade VIII and into Grade IX at Booth Memorial High School. He is bound for an engineering course, he says, but that's in the future.

At present, one big interest, besides winning the Derby, is building model airplanes. He is saving up to buy a model gas engine with which he can really put his own designs to a test.

"I read a lot of books on flying too," he explained and from them develops ideas. "Got a collection of mechanic books that high," and he indicated with his hands a three-foot height.

Last year, in an unofficial soap-box race here, Arthur collaborated with Brian Roberts to build a car and it "didn't run too bad."

The Derby will be run Friday evening to open the Prince Rupert Exhibition. Race track is on Second Avenue, between Third and McBride Street, ending just in front of the Civic Centre building.

schools cannot be given any priority assistance in their steel requirements. Commercial construction needing steel materials has been completely held up by federal government order," he said.

While both Canadian and American steel producers are undergoing large scale expansion programs, Mr. Beam said that their production would not be appreciably increased until the second half of 1952 and "in the meantime the enlargement of our steel mills is itself requiring large quantities of the metal."

Other basic industry expansion programs which he said were so vital at this time and construction work connected with the preparedness program are all heavy users of steel materials. "For the time being other projects will have to take second place," the Ottawa official declared.
